



had one of the biggest songs by a female artist this year (and it should have charted higher based on research) with 'Johnny and June' – a very positive view of a relationship. Most of the rest of the crop is singing about how bad men are and I'm not sure that's ringing true with female listeners of the format.

1720 regional promoter **Mike Severson**: "Female artists are struggling because they aren't releasing songs that strongly connect with 25+ adult woman. That is our core, isn't it? Yet we have Taylor, Carrie, Kellie, Jessica, Kristy Lee, Carter's Chord, Julianne, Laura, Katie, Miranda, and others who appeal to a younger-skewing audience and who are relatively young artists themselves. It's great we are gaining appeal with the younger demos – we must have them for our future success – but perhaps we have ignored the more adult and mature women who drive the Country format. We can't always get them via their children.

"I think back not too long ago when the females were ruling and it was exactly when more mature artists were releasing relevant songs to a grown-up audience - Trisha, Wynonna, Patty, Reba, Martina, Faith, Shania, and others who spoke to the heart of a woman. Maybe that is what's not happening now."
