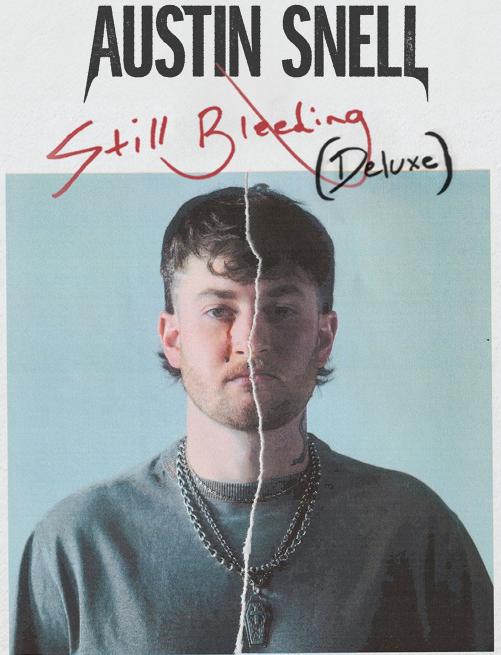

St. Jude: 35 Years, \$1B & Counting

"Country cares for St. Jude kids – it's not just a slogan. It's not just the name of this event. It's our commitment ... it's been our passion ... for 35 years. Country cares for St. Jude kids." That was co-founder **Lon Helton** at the opening session of the Oct. 21-22 **St. Jude Country Cares Seminar** in Memphis, an event punctuated at its closing gala with the news that the country music and Country radio community – personalities, programmers, artists, labels and listeners – have raised more than \$1 billion so that "no child should die in the dawn of life."

In the days preceding that galvanizing moment (<u>Breaking News 10/22</u>), broadcasters from multiple formats across the U.S. learned about radiothon best-practices, toured parts of the facility, heard from patients and their families, and were briefed on St. Jude's effort to bring its life-saving cures to the world. They were joined by more than two dozen artists, their label representatives, social media influencers and other industry execs. Approximately half of those present were first-time attendees.

Old Dominion received the "Angels Among Us Award" for their service to St. Jude, and performed on the final night along with **Megan Moroney**. During their acceptance speech, Old Dominion's **Trevor Rosen** revealed that his wife had battled non-Hodgkin's lymphoma at 17, making the band's commitment to St. Jude more personal. "There is always hope, and miracles do happen," he said. "And a lot of those things happen because of St. Jude."



Jon Pardi channeled his inner Elvis as the opening night performer on the campus of Graceland, playing several Presley songs in his set. The seminar's surprise performers included **Brad Paisley**, who sang a few songs at a luncheon and called St. Jude "the greatest place there is," and **Drew Baldridge**, who played St. Jude-referencing new single "Tough

Q3 CDM Drivetime Leaders

Following the <u>analysis</u> of the format's Q3 drive-time leaders in PPM markets last month, **Country Aircheck** has also compiled Country's top performers for the quarter from Nielsen's 44 Continuous Diary Measurement (CDM) markets.

For the third consecutive quarter the overall leader, WIVK/
Knoxville, also leads both drivetimes. Morning hosts Joey Tack and
Nancy Barger retain their lead despite slipping a share-and-a-half. Their
11.6 holds off WHKO/Dayton's New Country Mornings with Nancy
Wilson and Woody, which rises 0.8 shares to come within two tenths of
of the top. Another pair of Ohioans, WKKO/Toledo's Lyn & Marco take
the bronze with their 10.4 share.

Following the retirement of longtime afternoon host **Ted "Gunner" Ousley** after the spring book, WIVK's afternoon shift was taken over by **Sean "Mac" McNally** – and Mac is off to a strong start. Not only did he keep the station's format lead, but its rise of nine tenths of a share gives it the largest share for any station in afternoon drive in more than two years. Repeating its second-place finish in afternoons is WHKO, thanks to Jake

The Listening Room Founder/CEO

Chris Blair shares his most influential musical moments:

1. "Eye of the Tiger." This was my hype song in all sports. I played ice hockey and other sports growing up and this was my locker room song on repeat before every practice and every game. Years later, it came full circle when I met [Survivor's]

Jim Peterik for the first time. We hit it off and are now very close friends. He visits me every time he's in Nashville, I have been to his house in Chicago and it's one of the coolest moments to have the song that pumped me up before every event become a great connection to the band and songwriter.

- **2. Anything by Poison.** This could be a list of Poison, Skid Row, Mötley Crüe, etc. It's the music I grew up on. My first electric guitar and small little amp in my bedroom wailed the crappy versions of me trying to play the solos and lead guitar parts to all the hair bands I loved growing up.
- **3. Garth Brooks was my first concert.** He's also the reason I'm in Nashville. I saw him in 1991 at what was then known as Starwood Amphitheater. He was a big reason I got into music. Full circle when he played at TLR 30 years later, we talked about how he was a big influence on me.
- **4. "Something In The Water."** When it comes to the music I listen to most of the time now, it's demos and songwriters. But there is something about the way that Carrie, Brett [James] and Chris [DeStefano] wrote "Something In The Water" that is just a brilliant way of saying what they wanted to say, and Carrie crushed it vocally. I also love how she throws in "Amazing Grace" at the end. I's just one of those songs that is meaningful, has a nice drive and upbeat feel.
- **5. "Quiet."** Most people probably don't know this, but it's special to me because it's the first song that I took my daughter, Emerson, into the studio to record. It's originally a Hillsong Christian song that was recorded by Diana Trout, but my daughter wanted to sing in the studio. So, when she was 10 years old, I took her in and we did a daddy/daughter version. It's out now!

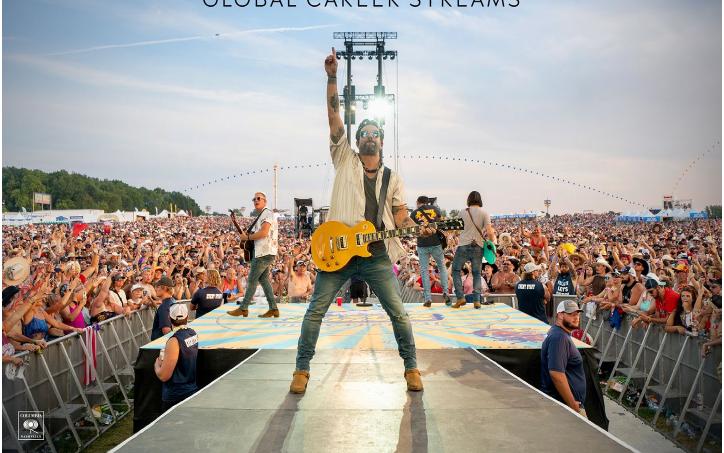

In addition to functioning as a store, the space is intended to be used for music, local artisan workshops and community events.

Walton Stations has closed on the sale of its radio cluster in Rudiso, NM, to **M.T.D. Inc.** The cluster includes Classic Country **KWES-FM** and Country **KWES-AM**.

People" ahead of a session and said of the hospital, "You come here and realize how small your problems are."

Speakers included iHeartMedia Digital Audio Group CEO **Conal Byrne**, who emphasized the power of audio as "the ultimate storytelling platform," and got choked up speaking about his own experience as the parent of a baby born prematurely, and "the wreckage of medical challenges" his family experienced as a result. Byrne called broadcast radio "the oxygen we breathe in the United States," and noted that "audio speaks to real American consumers," while also touting podcasting as "a mass reach medium" that continues to grow. Byrne also spoke about the high "trust factor" broadcast radio has with its listeners, who view the medium as a "friend or companion."

Specifically referencing radiothons, Byrne noted that "the best storytelling is always personal," and got a laugh when he shared simple advice from iHeart's **Bobby Bones**: "Just say the phone number slower." Summing up, Byrne said, "What we need more than anything is to be inspired, not influenced ... If I wield that influence well, I might be able to help the partners that really matter, like St. Jude."

At another session, radio panelists shared some of their best practices for getting the most out of their radiothons. iHeartMedia personality **Angie Ward**, who is heard on multiple stations, said when pre-recording content for each one, she listens first to the patient vignettes that precede her breaks

so she can react with "real emotion," saying even if it takes her hours longer to track those shows, it's worthwhile because of the importance of St. Jude. "It's OK to show your emotions on the air," she said, noting that she's seen that – particularly for male broadcasters – "If your voice cracks on the air, the phones will ring." She also encouraged stations to "throw your programming book out the window for those two days" of the radiothon," joking, "You will not hit your stop sets on the right bow ties."

Ward also shared advice on how to handle radiothons this year in markets that have been impacted by hurricanes. "Just acknowledge it and say, 'We know we've asked you for [hurricane relief] money, but that doesn't negate that kids are getting cancer." Later, she added that broadcasters "have been given a gift of this megaphone to get the word out."

Answering an audience question about how tightly to plan the radiothon's on-air content, Ward said, "Plan, but prepare for it to go out the window" in favor of more spontaneous moments. Quoting boxer

Mike Tyson, WUSY/Chattanooga's **Greg "StyckMan" Owens** said, "Everybody has a plan until they get punched in the face."

Sharing one of his own practices, Owens said he plays the audio of a phone ringing quietly in the background to spur real callers during his station's radiothons. WBKR/Owensboro, KY's **Chad Benefield** encouraged stations to utilize social media as part of their fundraising efforts, joking that they should "leverage it like the warfare it is."

KBAY/San Jose's **Emily Harlan** spoke about toggling between giving out the phone and text-to-donate numbers when activity on one or the other slows down. She stressed the importance of visiting the St. Jude campus prior to her radiothon, noting that one caller told her she was donating for the first time after hearing Harlan and her colleagues share their firsthand experiences there. Harlan also said KBAY doesn't pre-promote its radiothons because they don't want listeners to think "that's too heavy for me" and pre-plan to tune out.

At another session, **Cassie Smith**, VP/Marketing for St. Jude's fundraising and awareness organization ALSAC, told broadcasters, "You bring our brand to life every day with the stories you tell." She cited internal research showing that St. Jude donors are twice as likely to shop brands that partner with the hospital, and that "40% would give up their regular brand to shop with a St. Jude partner." She added, "Continue to be proud of what you do for St. Jude. You are saving lives."

During a press conference, Old Dominion's **Matthew Ramsey** talked about how Country Cares founder **Randy Owen** and St. Jude have "mobilized an entire genre of music ... That's pretty impressive." During the closing dinner, ALSAC Pres./CEO **Richard Shadyac Jr.** announced that a studio at the ALSAC headquarters was being named for Owen and his wife, Kelly, in recognition of their decades-long support of the hospital.

Asked about the continued emphasis on radio for their fundraising efforts, Shadyac said, "I can't tell you how many families have [told me] they heard about St. Jude because they listen to [a partner station] in their hometown. The radiothons give us Partners In Hope, which are our sustainers. They choose to give monthly, which allows us to know we're going to have that repeat revenue every month. Unlike a typical children's hospital, about 89% of the money necessary to operate St. Jude has to be raised, which means it comes from donations rather than patient billings. Country music and radiothons are a major part of what gives us our sustainer base. That's how important it is, on top of all the awareness."

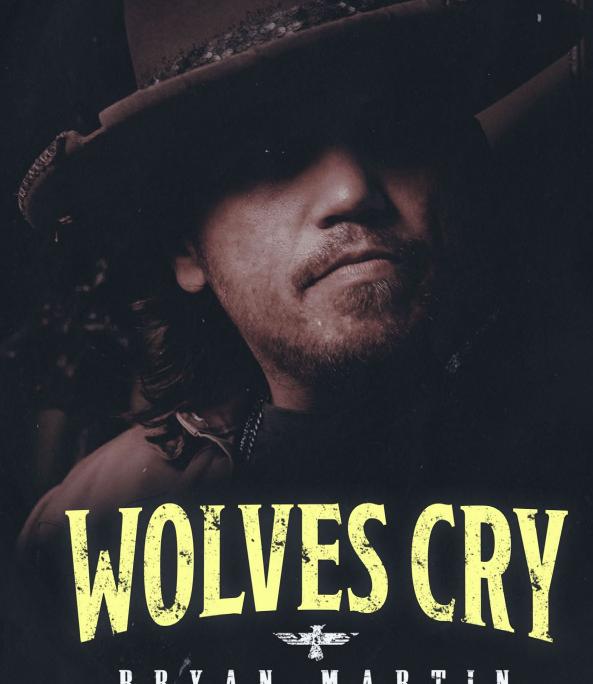
Sustaining St. Jude's mission means an expansion, as well. As noted during the seminar, U.S. pediatric cancer survival rates were 20% in 1962, and have risen to today's survival rate of 80% – in no small part because of the hospital's work. Worldwide, however, it's still 1962. More than 400,000 children are diagnosed with cancer each year, but the global survival rate is still only 20%. St. Jude Children's Research Hospital – with the ongoing support of its partners – is determined to lift that number. "This is the world we can create together when we're united with purpose behind a common mission," Shadyac said as the event drew to a close. —Phyllis Stark **CAC**

NEW COUNTRY AIRCHECK/MEDIABASE REPORTER WEIGHTS

These are the new weights for **Country Aircheck/Mediabase** Country Reporters for both the Published and the Activator panels, based on audience figures from Nielsen. Weights for stations in PPM markets use a three-month average of April-May-June 2024 AQH Persons. The Spring 2024 AQH Persons figure is used for diary markets. The weights are calculated using this formula: Market rank is multiplied by 10 and then added to the station's AQH Persons.

A station's weight is determined by dividing that adjusted AQH by the leading Country station's adjusted AQH. For this period, that station is **WUSN/Chicago** with an adjusted AQH of 19,230. For Activator weights, that station is **WIOV/Lancaster**, **PA** with an adjusted AQH of 7,070. Station Weight = AQHP + (Market rank X 10) divided by 19.230 (7,070 for Activator stations.) These new weights are effective with this week's Country Aircheck/Mediabase Country chart.

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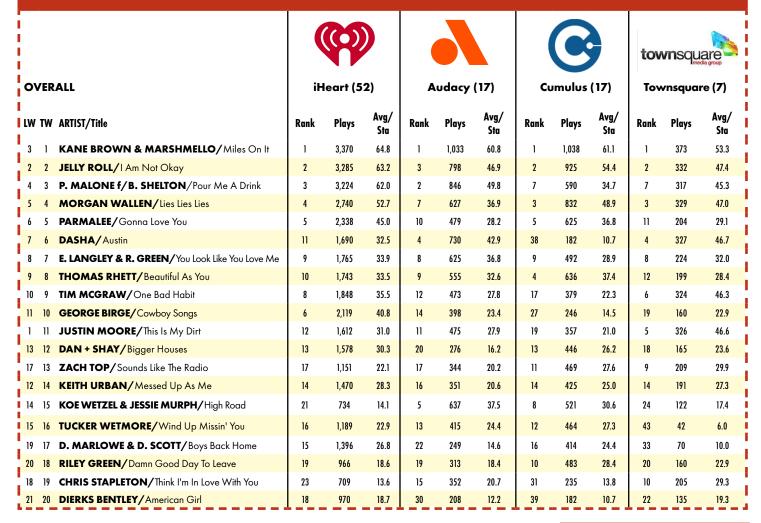
