People Meter Pumps Up Country

Programmers in four markets – Atlanta, Dallas, Detroit and Washington DC – received pre-currency PPM data from Arbitron for the very first time last week. And, while we're prohibited from providing actual shares and cume figures for pre-currency PPM data, we went through the numbers to provide a broad overview of what happened with PPM in those four markets. (For a complete look at the Oct. PPM ratings for seven markets where PPM is currency, go here.)

It's important to point out that the October 2008 PPM precurrency figures are the first PPM results for those markets, so there are no previous month comparisons. And, it's not applesto-apples comparisons to judge PPM results side-by-side with the Summer diary-based book in these markets. However, it is interesting to see the different metrics that PPM brings to the table vs. the diary. It's also enlightening to see how Country is faring under the glare of the new methodology.

It's also worth pointing out that October would seem to be a pretty tough month for Country in a PPM world. PPM results have seemed to be far more sensitive to marketplace machinations, and there was no shortage of outside forces during this period, what with baseball playoffs and the election.

Atlanta: Overall, Country fared a lot better with PPM than it did in the Summer 2008 diary-based report. While the overall Country cume didn't double as we've seen in other new PPM markets, it did increase by almost 70% over Summer 2008. (continued on page 5)

Market Sucks \$4.8B From Sirius

"We think the environment sucks," said **Sirius XM** CEO **Mel Karmazin** about the auto industry on a conference call with

- **2. Anne Murray, "Can I Have This Dance":** I'm such a girl! Some guy is *so* going to play this for me someday. Probably the reason I'm still



PPM Pumps Up Country (continued from page 1)

The format also tacked on almost two-and-a-half extra shares of Country, with most of the increase going to Citadel's **WKHX**. Clear Channel's **WUBL** PPM 12+ share was just above its summer book.

WKHX's PPM 12+ share gain vaulted it into fourth place; the summer book gave WKHX a 3.4 and an 11th rank. KIX also ranked fourth 25-54 in PPM; it ranked 10th last summer. WUBL ranked 21st in 12+ PPM shares vs. 19th in the summer. 25-54, it ranked 21st in both PPM and in the Summer '08 sweep.

Dallas: PPM results were eye-popping in the Big D. The Country cume delivered by Cumulus' **KPLX** (**The Wolf**) and Citadel's **KSCS** more than doubled when compared to the Summer '08 book, with KPLX breaking well above the one million mark. In fact, if The Wolf's cume holds at this level into next month's currency phase, it will become the most listened-to Country station in the USA. That blockbuster cume helped propel KPLX into a tie for first 12+ and a second place finish 25-54. The summer book put The Wolf in a tie for eighth 12+ and in 13th, 25-54.

PPM numbers for Citadel's KSCS place it eighth 12+ and in a tie for fourth, 25-54. The summer book had it 15th 12+ and 14th 25-54.

Detroit: Both CBS Radio's **WYCD** and Clear Channel's **WDTW** got the now seemingly requisite cume bumps from PPM, although not quite double the cume garnered by the pair in the Summer '08 Arbitron. Both stations also enjoyed an increase in shares over the summer book. The 25-54 ranks were relatively flat, with WYCD showing eighth in the summer and in the Oct. PPM, while WDTW was 19th last summer and 17th in the PPM.

Washington, DC: The good news is that the 12+ cume for Clear Channel's **WMZQ** was up 70% over Summer 2008. The bad news is that it ranks 15th 12+ in PPM, compared to ninth last summer. 25-54, WMZQ ranked 16th in PPM vs. eighth last summer.




