CRS Survey Says: Get Out!

Reviewing and expanding on this year's CRS research project, NuVoodoo EVP/Research Analysis Leigh Jacobs urges radio pros to



"give [listeners] the show" they tuned in to hear. He spoke to Country Aircheck about his surprises and concerns from the 1,500-person survey, presented last month. (See the full presentation here.)

CA: What were the biggest takeaways?

LJ: Get out! If you've got a station and you can get it outside the studio and do a live broadcast with some regularity, even if it's a client location thing, be visible. Stations have no marketing budget

anymore, and we found the audience is thrilled to see stations out doing live broadcasts, so go do that.

You have a format with beloved music. Doing this study for CRS meant there's tremendous focus on "is the music itself getting better in the eyes of the audience?" and emphatically it is. While there are some in the minority who disapprove of some of the collaborations and changes in sounds, in the main, it's being embraced. You just have a sense that there's a certain amount of pride that the music is getting more widespread acceptance.

There was focus on two big tune-out issues – commercial breaks and playlist problems - yet many programmers may not have much control over those factors. What do you say to them?

In the words of Teddy Roosevelt, "do what you can with what have where you are." You're not going to change the commercial load, but you may look at a quarter hour or minute-by-minute analysis to see if you should relocate a break. Or you can look around at which of the hours within the daypart have the worst PUMM levels and make the better-rated hours contain fewer spots.

There are only three things a listener can do: they can turn it up, turn it down or turn it off. You don't have a skip button, so you are optimizing a playlist for a large number of people. It's only one music stream [so] use every bit of intel you've got and every bit of insight and intuition you have about what song goes next.

Speaking of playlists, what about the conundrum of big streaming titles that don't research?

Great streaming numbers are across a very wide population and

Previewing As CBS Hits The Road

New CBS-TV singing competition series The Road won't debut until the fall (CAT 2/25), but thanks to retired Country Radio Hall of Famer Gregg Lindahl, Country Aircheck readers get a sneak peek at what to expect. Lindahl was in the audience March 9 at Oklahoma Ranch in Oklahoma City, where the show's third episode was filmed.

Executive Producer Blake Shelton and headliner Keith Urban were also in the house.

The Taylor Sheridan-produced show focuses on a group of country artists who serve as Urban's opening acts, competing to secure a spot in the next city and remain on the tour. Urban and the contestants have been performing in venues in Texas and Oklahoma throughout March, and fans



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have been able to score tickets for free. A small percentage of them were given devices with which to vote for their favorite openers. The show moves to Memphis tonight (3/24), after which the last two episodes will be shot in Nashville: March 28 at Marathon Music Works and the April 2 finale at the Ryman Auditorium.

At the taping Lindahl attended, there were nine contestants, one of which he recognized as a rising Nashville songwriter. Each sang a cover and an original; most also played an instrument during their performance and were, Lindahl says, "incredibly impressive." Contestants performed "the two-minute award show versions of songs," he recalls. "They were really tight – no long intros, just right into a verse and chorus." All were backed by the same house band. Among the covers, two were Dolly Parton hits, and one was a Bob Dylan song.

The taping featured a surprise performance from **Gretchen Wilson**, who played "Here For The Party" as what Lindahl described as "a warmup song." She also taped an intro for Urban and served as a de facto "host" for the evening. Both Urban and Shelton were on an elevated platform looking down at the stage during the opening act performances. Shelton was mic'd up for television, but did not interact with the live audience.

After the contestants performed, Urban took the stage for a six-song set of his hits and "just shredded," Lindahl said. "It was such a treat to see him in a small venue with a full band and about 500 other people. He put everything into the performance."

Lindahl describes the show's production as "a simple set and lighting, no video boards, no smoke or lasers, but just really well done. They were looking for lots of energy, and the crowd gave it to them." Voting results from the Oklahoma City show were not revealed to the audience, who were required to store their phones in Yondr pouches.

When the show debuts in the fall, Lindahl says viewers can expect to see "a tight, fast-paced competition with some extraordinary performances from guest stars and Keith Urban himself. I think it's going to be very music intensive."

Not only is this the largest add week in Church's career, but it is also the largest in the label's 15 years. Church's "Desperate Man" held both records previously with 116 adds on July 16, 2018.

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it's very difficult to know if that's enough different people in a place within the demographic that it will amount to a sufficient segment of your audience. The thing about a radio station playlist is it's consensus. You're hoping to keep a large group of people happy with a sequence of songs, which is a different thing than getting millions of people nationally or worldwide to listen to a song via streaming.


The research showed less interest in new music among younger demos.

Music discovery doesn't necessarily mean we're talking about young people. In fact, our data showed that there's less interest in music discovery among 18-24s than there is with 25-34 or 45-54, and it makes sense. If you're 18-24, you've got so much media and so many things to discover that music just isn't as important in your life as it might have been for any of us when we were that age.

It also showed men are more passionate about today's music than women.

I remember the years when music screeners for Country stations were almost entirely women, and we were among those proponing to get some men. This is an adult format; it shouldn't be AC with steel guitars. Like anything else, you adjust something and at some point, you go a little too far and then you have to pull it back. [NuVoodoo Pres.] Carolyn [Gilbert] monitors the fielding of every project we do, and she has been noticing that it is axiomatically true that women are more cooperative for any kind of market research than men. But suddenly we were not filling samples with younger women as quickly as we used to. That's a flag [and] due to a few

things. The controllable part of it is maybe it's easy to make stations too male leaning. If women get disenchanted listening to the Country station, then it makes them harder to find.

What was the biggest surprise in the research?

I wasn't expecting so many people to be aware of jocks who had lost jobs.

Yet we just saw another round of layoffs.

That's the economic reality of the business now.


What is the biggest warning sign in the data?

Go to Best Buy and try to buy a boom box. I dare you. If you're not doing a great job streaming your station, if your app doesn't look and feel great and doesn't have a great user experience, if your promo for your app is "download our app," without selling the benefits of what I get as a result, you're in trouble. You're missing the future.


What was the most encouraging takeaway?

Country listeners are still engaging with the personalities on stations. It's incredibly important that radio talent in 2025 realize that the stage got really, really big. It used to be you were talking to people stuck listening to whatever was on the dial; now you're exposed to all this media and

the morning show has to be really funny or entertaining. If you can't be incredibly funny, you can at least be involved in the community and relate to things that matter to the people there in ways that allow them to feel seen.

With a lot of people voicetracking and doing shifts on six different radio stations, it can become a grind. The next break is just one of 75 you'll do in the next hour. But there's a pretty good chance if the station's playing something, it's because they think a lot of people love it. So give them the benefit of the doubt and put that much emotion into it. It's something that's easy for on air talent to get jaded about, but you accepted the role where your character loves all these songs, so give them the show.




