The Professor Is In

On top of busy industry careers, some prominent executives have chosen to give back by teaching at the college level. The rewards

include nurturing talent, keeping up with GenZ and identifying future hires. The challenges include a heavy time commitment, adapting a syllabus that evolves as fast as the music business and, occasionally, flunking a student.

Big Machine EVP/GM Kris Lamb has been Adjunct Professor of Record Label Operations at Nashville's Belmont University since 2017. Alliance Artist and Media Relations owner Jennifer Bohler has been an Adjunct at Auburn since 2019. Wheelhouse Records VP/Promotion Ken Tucker

taught a public relations in the music business class at Belmont from 2009-2013. And Results Global Chief Marketing Officer Jackie Campbell and COO John Zarling have led a partner-marketing class at Belmont since 2022 that is now part of the school's Dolly U curriculum.

On The Lamb: Lamb began teaching a music promotion strategies class at Belmont after his former Lyric Street colleague, Doug Howard, became Dean of its Mike Curb College of

Entertainment & Music Business. He was drawn to the idea of getting future label staffers excited about choosing the promotion side of the business, and



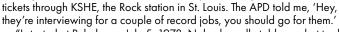

All You Nied Is Love

Recently retired Warner/WMN Regional Mgr./ Radio-West Mark Niederhauser could fill a book or two, given his lengthy tenures in both pop and country promotion. His first full-time job was selling flooring, but just a few weeks in, a promoter he'd worked for in college tracked him down. "They paid me \$150 a week in cash - no taxes, no insurance, no nothing," he recalls. "I did that for about a year, selling

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so I just did what I said I was going to do," he explains. "There were so many who didn't. I distinguished myself pretty quickly." Two years at Polydor were the start of a 32-year career across nine different pop and rock labels, including RCA, Geffen, Giant and Virgin. "Rick Springfield was especially memorable; he was just bigger than life. I used to carry a paper bag in my suitcase – back then we used real briefcases because somebody would always hyperventilate in the meet and greet line, and I'd pull out the paper bag to keep them from passing out."

A colleague from his RCA days, Allen Butler, went into country and began sending Niederhauser CDs. "When I heard 'Brand New Man,' that's when I really started listening to country. Ronnie Dunn's voice was undeniable." Later, at independent rock label Wind-up, he started considering a format flip. "I knew if we didn't have a really great year they were just going to run out of money," he admits. "I saw something about Chris Stacey joining Warner, called him and told him I wanted to go country. He said, 'Wait a minute I haven't even started yet.' I eventually I got the call and was off to the races."

Niederhauser says his move to Warner was perfect timing, joining shortly after John Esposito took over the label, "He had absolutely

changed the culture in that building. Kristen [Williams] had just come back from maternity leave and was promoted to National. I loved the people; I loved the artists. I worked the tail end of Blake Shelton's 'All About Tonight' and then we reeled off 17 No. 1s in a row.

"Country's just a more real format and a friendlier place to reside," he continues. "There's no comparison. I'm still friends with John Oates and Rick Springfield, but they're not the same kind of connections as I have with Blake, Cole [Swindell] and Brett [Eldredge]."

As for what kept him going so long, "I'm a music lover. Amy Lee of Evanescence asked me one night at catering if I was staying for the show. She didn't really know me at the time. I said, 'If I get a chance to hear somebody who sings like you, there's no way I'm leaving till you're absolutely done.' She said, 'Nobody ever stays for the show.'"

Niederhauser's love for the job extended to some of aspects others find unappealing, including the travel. And travel is one reason he finally decided to log off Mediabase for good. "I went to see Hootie & The Blowfish in West Palm Beach and was flying home on a Sunday morning," he explains. "The







airport was packed with people coming back from cruises. I sat there looking at people who were all my age or older and, quite honestly, they all looked like shit. I said out loud, 'I need to retire now and go travel for fun before I look and feel like these people.'"

His parting words for the next generation of reps: "Do what you say you're going to do, and you will distinguish yourself from people that don't follow through," he says. "That's what helped me separate myself from the pack 46 years ago and it's still sound advice."

potentially making those students more employable. And he would bring in radio execs including Rod Phillips and Charlie Cook to offer insights.

Like his job title, Lamb's course evolved into a broader record label operations curriculum, and is now required to graduate from the Curb College. Lamb teaches it one night a week during the fall semester. Vector Management's Brad Turcotte, as Assistant Professor at Belmont, has been teaching the same course since 2023, along with classes on the international music business and music industry PR. Lamb teaches students about "every department of a functioning record label and how they integrate." At the end of each semester, his students make a group presentation to himself and BMLG Chairman/CEO Scott Borchetta, and the label group has incorporated some student ideas into the real-life marketing strategies.

"I get inspired and passionate speaking with students about how they consume music and what they want to see" from artists, Lamb says, citing preferred frequency of TikTok posts as a common query. "All of those things that anybody in the music business should be asking, I'm able to ask them. And it definitely fuels my batteries; I get as much out of it as the students do." Not only has Lamb hired some of his former students as interns or staff, he's also taught future artists Dasha and Mackenzie Carpenter.

Last fall, Lamb had the difficult task of flunking a student who "failed to show up" and didn't pull their weight in group projects. For the most part, however,

Lamb has found his students to be "highly passionate and engaged."

Best Bib & Tucker: Tucker taught a music business PR class at Belmont for several years while at *Billboard*, *Country Weekly* and Beats Music. "My first semester, there was one kid who kept nodding off," he laughs. "That doesn't do a lot for your morale." But Tucker quickly adapted to a more interactive approach, including bringing in bad press releases received in his day job as a journalist as examples of what not to do.

He failed about three out of the hundreds of students he taught but, like Lamb, Tucker took it hard. "I tried every single way to figure out how to pass these folks." Guest speakers he invited included Monarch Publicity's Cindy Hunt and Heather Conley, and he'd have real artists – once including Walker Hayes – share their story as the basis for student-written bios. Tucker went light on tests and quizzes in favor of assignments a publicist might actually do, including tracking a real artist's social media presence.

The fact that "there are people interested in our industry who wanted to learn more" energized Tucker, and he often found students to be "more entrepreneurial than some people who have been in the business a long time."

War Eagle: Bohler started with one music business class at Auburn (PR), but after relocating there now teaches four, including Promoting Artists and Record Label Procedures, as well as an honors class called The Power of Music, focused on artists who use their voice for positive change. She also works with the school's internship program, all while continuing to operate her PR firm.

Initially "intrigued, but also somewhat terrified, because publicists are typically behind the scenes," Bohler warmed to the idea of teaching. "Having to speak twice weekly to a group of students was kind of scary, but it became fun because nothing like that had been taught at Auburn. And these students were so interested in [music industry PR] that I got excited about it all over again."

She found teaching to be more than standing in a classroom talking. "You've got to make [lesson] plans, book guests and – because the music industry is so fluid – stay on top of what's happening." The first year-and-a-half spent getting her "sea legs" gave her a newfound respect for educators at every level. Meanwhile, music biz jargon and practices she took for granted had to be spelled out to students. "I had to slow down and explain what a press release was and why it's important, or why record labels do things a certain way," she says. Bohler's guests have included Randy Goodman, Troy Tomlinson, Katie Dean, Steve Schnur, Anastasia Brown, Neal Spielberg, Zarling, Turcotte and publicists Ronna Rubin, Ebie McFarland and Tyne Parrish.

Energy and enthusiasm from her students are among the greatest rewards, and Bohler has learned to identify "the ones who are going to make that launch to Nashville, L.A., New York, Atlanta – some even have their eyes on London."

Islands In The Stream: Zarling's relationship with Belmont has evolved from student to board member to, now, Adjunct Professor. The course he and Campbell co-teach is a one-credit elective that takes half a semester to complete. "We keep it really high level, examining the principles and strategies of partnership marketing," Campbell says.

After the first year they realized "these are students and don't know a whole heck of a lot yet," Campbell says, "so we tried to simplify down to the big topics." Before this year's launch of the Dolly U curriculum, Campbell says "every year we would either work with a label partner and/or an artist management team to pick an artist focus" for the class, often based on which industry colleagues were up for being a guest speaker. With Parton as the sole focus, Campbell noticed that students' excitement level elevated. In their first year teaching, "We were disappointed because we could not get them to ask questions," Campbell says. But this year they've been "very engaged. We've been really impressed with them."

Even with a half-semester course, the time commitment is substantial. Zarling says the motivation is to "pay it forward" to an industry they love, "but also to keep ourselves plugged in with the next generation and make sure that we're not losing sight of what reality is for them as they enter into this world."

"We have so many conversations about how to reach Gen Z, and we literally have access to them every week in our class," Campbell says. "We ask them questions about what kind of merch they would buy or what kind of fan club they would participate in. It's fun to have that real life focus group."

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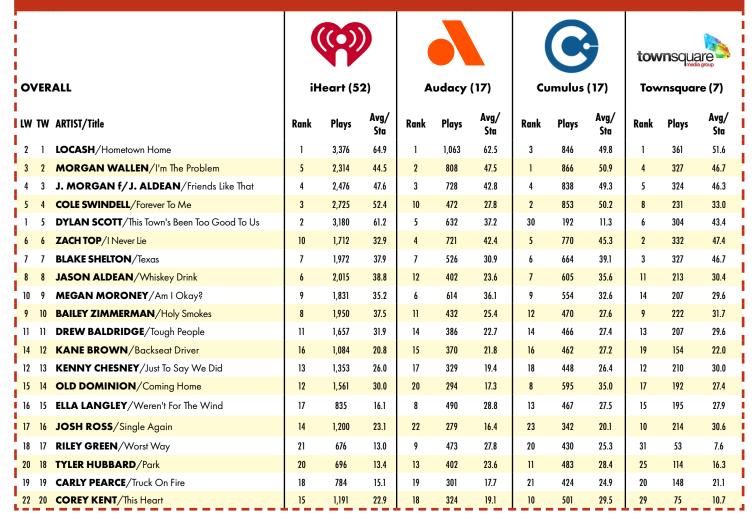
