WSOC Turns 50

Among the longest running Country stations on FM, Beasley WSOC/Charlotte celebrates 50 years in the format this year. Country Aircheck spoke to some of 'SOC's biggest names about the milestones and stories that stand out in a half-century of Country radio. From dueling banjos and horrific hurricanes to NASCAR and call letters that stand for community service, WSOC has made an indelible mark on country music.

Inauspicious Beginnings: Cox's WSOC-AM was pulling a 13-share with its MOR format in 1971, but the Beautiful Music FM sister barely registered. Radio Manager John Harper had lobbied unsuccessfully to place a Country format on the FM, but things changed that April when WSOC-TV lured Carolina native and "Dueling Banjos" writer Arthur Smith and his popular weekly TV show from crosstown WBT-TV. With a country music star in the halls, Harper's pleas were taken seriously.

Harper and Smith designed the new format for WSOC, which debuted July 12, 1971. Harper relinquished his responsibilities for the AM and focused solely on programming the FM while doing a live morning show from 6-9am. Harper's morning show became so

popular it even had a fan club headed by Lib Hatcher – the same woman who discovered, managed and married Randy Travis. After the morning show, the rest of the day was automated with music on reels, and that was how WSOC existed for its first several years.

Former Top 40 programmer **Don Bell** arrived in 1975, just as WSOC topped its primary competitor WAME-AM for the first time. A year later, Harper exited, and Bell replaced him with a young West Virginia DJ

named **Bob Call**. "When I joined WSOC in the summer of 1977, it was right after Elvis passed away," Call says. "[Don] wanted me to bring some Top 40 principles to our Country delivery and make it more contemporary." Bell also brought in jocks to replace daypart automation, first with WSOC traffic reporter **Bill Ellis** in middays, then **Edd Robinson** from WAME-AM in afternoons.



Academy To Honor, Party In Nashville

After a year off, **ACM** Honors returns for its 14th iteration at Nashville's Ryman Auditorium Aug. 25. New to Music City the day prior is *Party For A Cause (P4AC)* benefiting

ACM Lifting Lives at Ascend Amphitheater. While it's not quite "the week Vegas goes country," the back-to-back events are as close as the industry is likely to get to its annual "away game" ... at least until 2022.

Long associated with the awards show and other events in Las Vegas, *Party For A Cause* wasn't staged around the last two telecasts in Nashville. "Once the pandemic seemed to be calming down, we had a lot of discussions


(continued on page 5) labels, and we've been able to build a stellar lineup."

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Lee Brice, Brett Eldredge, Mickey Guyton, Sam Hunt, Old Dominion, Tenille Townes and Trisha Yearwood will be joined by a few more big names who have yet to be announced. SiriusXM's **Storme**

Warren will host the Tuesday night show.



Lifting Lives will be marking a monumental 2020 (details here). "We raised \$3.6 million and distributed it directly to folks who desperately needed it because of the touring industry shutdown," Cruz says. In addition to ticket revenue, donations will be encouraged. "There is still need in the touring industry," Cruz says. "We continue to review applications and are finding that even though many are back on

the road, it's limited dates and there's still debt to dig out of."

Yes Your Honors: Though he's attended before, this will be
Academy CEO Damon Whiteside's first time overseeing ACM
Honors. "We had the Ryman Auditorium on hold last year and held
out hope for the event as long as we could," he says. "Ultimately, it

Damen Whiteside was clear we couldn't have an audience, which doesn't make much sense for what the event is. Obviously, this year will be a slightly longer show as we celebrate 2019 and 2020 honorees, but it will be worth the wait."

For the 2019 eligibility year, Studio Recording Award (SRA) and Industry Award winners will be honored, as will the Special Awards honorees. For 2020, Industry Awards – which focus on the live music business – are not being bestowed,

but SRA winners will be recognized. See all the honorees <u>here</u>. Lauren Alaina, Devin Dawson, Sara Evans, Hardy, Chris Janson, Lady A, Ashley McBryde, RaeLynn, Lee Ann Womack and other TBA performers will be joined by host **Carly Pearce**.

One aspect that will be missed is the presence of ACM SVP/ Creative & Content **Lisa Lee** – longtime producer and writer of Honors – who is on medical leave. "Her heart is in this show, and she'll be with us in spirit," Whiteside says. "She was working on it in the months prior to her leave, so her fingerprints are still there. We look forward to having her back next year."

A **Circle Network** live-stream and edited broadcast of *Honors* are an extension of the Academy's temporary Nashville shift. "We've had a close partnership the last couple years, and they jumped at the chance to share Honors with a wider and international audience," Whiteside says. "We're excited fans can see it that night, as well as the cutdown version later."


The events cap a year of change for the Academy. "We've had to innovate, move from Vegas to Nashville twice for the awards show and devoted almost all of our Lifting Lives efforts to COVID relief for our industry," Whiteside says. "Now we get to celebrate that and move into phase-two of our continuing support. Our board, the industry and the artists have embraced this and wanted to be involved, and that's very exciting and humbling."

While WSOC was staffing up, other factors were falling into place to seed the station's growth. FM radio usage was overtaking AM across the country, the popularity of country music was surging, and Arbitron expanded the Charlotte metro area – a boon for WSOC's 100,000-watt FM signal and a death knell for its 5,000-watt AM competitor.


Market Dominance: Call left to program KYGO/Denver in 1980 (where he is now Market Manager), and Bell brought in a DJ from Humboldt, TN to replace him. Bill Dollar led mornings for the next 14 years and became the final pillar of a lineup with Ellis and Robinson that was in place for most of the decade. WSOC hit No. 1 in the market for the first time in the Spring 1981 book and went on to claim 37 more No. 1s over the next 50 surveys.

CRHOF member Gregg Lindahl recalls taking over as GM in 1986. "My predecessor **Lee Morris** and PD Don Bell had a very solid foundation in place including the best airstaff I'd ever inherited," he says. WSOC got its first (and only) FM competitor in 1985 with WLVK, which later became WTDR and is now iHeartMedia's WKKT. In 1987, original middayer Bill Ellis left for mornings at WSSL/Greenville, SC – a job he still holds 34 years later. That was followed by the departure of original afternoon host Edd Robinson. Despite



OFF THE RECORD

An Off The Record Conversation with iHeartMedia Dir./Artist Relations & Programs **Jackie Tigue**:

I grew up listening to KKBQ/Houston, KILT/Houston and Top 40 KRBE/Houston.

My start in the industry came after landing an executive assistant job in New York City that led to a move to Nashville for a newly created role within the company.

Rod Phillips, Tom Poleman, Bob Pittman, Marissa Morris and Jenny Sperling.

My favorite song on the radio in any format is "Half Of My Hometown." I'm obsessed with it and love a great country song that tells a story.

This past year or so, I learned my identity is heavily tied to my job, and as we transitioned to working from home, I had to set boundaries for myself to avoid burnout. Deep down, I know there is much more to me than what I do for a living, but dang I feel blessed to work in an industry that I love enough to eat, sleep and breathe it!

The pandemic-inspired life adaption I'm continuing is grooming my small dog at home. I realized I like the way it looks more when I do it, and it's cheaper!

At the height of the pandemic, I taught yoga online and invited a bunch of industry friends to participate to stay connected during a very weird time. Under normal circumstances, I consume and comment on other people's socials more often than post on my own.

I'm currently bingeing Succession. It starts slow, but once some of the main characters go off the rails, it gets interesting. And very much looking forward to bingeing Ted Lasso season two ... it's a feel-good show.

My top five most influential artists, songs, albums or concerts are:

- 1. **The Chicks' Wide Open Spaces**: I know every word to this album. The project felt like the first album that was my music instead of something my parents influenced.
- 2. **Runaway June's "We Were Rich"**: Ugh, this song makes me cry every time. I am an only child who grew up with two loving parents who worked their butts off and somehow were always there for soccer games and school functions. I wasn't spoiled with the material things, but I was spoiled with their time and attention. I hear a piece of my upbringing in that song.
- 3. **Alanis Morissette's Jagged Little Pill**: I re-listened to this album recently, and some of the lyrics are so strange, but ... what can I say? Middle school is a strange time.
- 4. **Sam Hunt's Between The Pines**: It's the swagger mixed with the authentic country roots for me. He has carved his own lane in country music with a sound that is unmistakably different and awesome.
- 5. **Morgan Wallen's Dangerous**: I'm so impressed by the songwriting and how it draws me in for 97 minutes every time I think I'll simply listen to a few tracks.

new competition and staff changes, WSOC was about to face its toughest challenge.

Hugo: On September 22, 1989, Hurricane Hugo struck the Carolina coast and marched inland. "We had a once-in-400-year hurricane," recalls **Paul Johnson**, who had taken over as PD just two years prior. "The winds were still over 100 miles-per-hour when it hit Charlotte. Most of the town lost power for























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at least two weeks, and the tower in front of our building got knocked down [into our offices]." Thanks to a lot of planning and preparation by Johnson and his staff, WSOC was able to remain on the air throughout and went several days without playing any music. "Nobody could watch TV because nobody had power. I was so proud of the effort we all put forward."

"It was tragic," says **Rick McCracken**, who spent 32 years at WSOC, and was doing

overnights at the time. "But it cemented us as a true communityoriented live and local radio station. We were about the only radio station that was able to stay on the air. We were the Hugo information experts. [The audience] needed us and we were there for them."

Lindahl adds, "WSOC's performance during Hurricane Hugo and its aftermath was lauded by listeners, city leaders, businesses and other media. The team was heroic and flawless in its coverage. It was radio at its best and WSOC lived up to its acronym 'We Serve Our Community.'"

Turn Left: One of the biggest ways WSOC has connected with the community is through one of the city's biggest attractions: NASCAR. "We took coverage of NASCAR to another level," says McCracken. "Whenever they came to Charlotte, we pretty much

lived at the speedway. We were the Speed Channel before there was a Speed Channel."

WSOC was known as the NASCAR station," says 25-year station vet **Chele Fassig**. "For two weeks every May and two weeks during the month of October, we submerged the station in everything NASCAR."

The '90s also brought change to WSOC, first with consolidation. The station was swapped from Cox to EZ Communications in 1993 and changed hands twice more before

the decade was over. Then, long-time morning host Bill Dollar traded shifts with middayer **Paul Schadt** in 1994. The decade



also brought one of the darkest moments in WSOC's history when, on the night of November 21, 1996, Dollar was killed in a car accident. His death sent shockwaves through the market as well as the country music and racing communities. "The hardest day I ever spent was the day after Dollar died," says McCracken.

Century 21: DJ Stout got his start at WSOC in 1989 while still in high school thanks to his uncle, Schadt, who landed him a job as the

station's bear mascot. "'SOC was my favorite station growing up," says Stout. While Schadt moved to WKKT in 1997, Stout was cutting his teeth programming WSOC's new sister station, Sports WFNZ. In 2005, Stout came full circle and added the PD duties for WSOC, a position he ultimately held longer than anyone else.

In 2009, WSOC was awarded ACM Station of the Year. "That would have to be up there," says Stout of his favorite memories of the station. "We'd come close so many times, and that was when our team was really just clicking, everybody worked so hard for that. We really were a team. We'd hang out outside of the office; we were tight." Since the market went PPM in 2010, WSOC has been No.1 40 times and has a talent lineup that has gone practically unchanged for 15 years.

"All of us here at WSOC, past and present, respect and embrace the importance it [has had] on the lives of our listeners and clients," says Fassig. "These call letters stand for We Serve Our Community, and it is our duty to continue the hard work and vision of our co-workers dating all the way back to 1971."






