### Remotes: Unofficially Speaking The new all-inclusive model (CAW 9/2/14) for the official


CMA Radio Remotes leading up to the annual awards show changes the game for non-sanctioned remote broadcasts. Or does it?

In Country Aircheck's postmortem on last year's CMA remotes (11/24/14), WXTU/Philadelphia PD Shelly Easton noted

that the organization's pay-your-own-way approach puts them in closer proximity to the off-brand version. "It was an expense we had to figure out," she said. "From that regard, depending on each chain's policy, it was no different than paying the money to go over to **Sharla McCoy**'s remotes for the same deal."

True? "I think it's great what they're doing," says McCoy, noting the CMA's changes haven't affected her business either way. "We both have the same goal. I love country music,

support the CMA and we send eyeballs to that telecast."



Personal Touches: "It's fewer stations, more intimate, we get a ton more time with the artists and more flexibility," says KNTY/Sacramento PD Tosh Jackson, who's been to McCoy's CMA remotes for the last five years. "She allows us to do a real intense video production setup we wouldn't be able to do at the [sanctioned remote]."

KXLY/Spokane PD Jay Daniels says not being able to get into the official remotes was never the is-(continued on page 9)

#### **Nashville Unplugged Live**

There's a lot more to country music than what listeners generally hear on the radio, and that reality means opportunity to songwriters Aaron Benward and Travis Howard and their weekly show Nashville Unplugged Live.

The concept launched two years ago following the success of Nashville Unplugged, a






radio listeners to what I consider to be the heroes behind country music – the songwriters," Benward says. "The station gave us the 9am hour Saturday morning and it was a success right out of the chute."

Songsmiths Paul Overstreet, Brett James, Shane MacAnally and Josh Osborne have appeared, as have songwriter/artists Brad Paisley, Florida Georgia Line, Sheryl Crow and others. Benward handles booking with

the help of contacts made through songwriting, the casino show and as half of former Curb duo Blue County.

Benward and Howard even have some radio history between them. "My very first job was doing overnights at a Christian radio station in Georgia when I was 15," Howard explains. "Back in those days Aaron and his dad were Christian singers and I was playing their songs way before I met him. To come back full-circle has been really fun. I'm a lot more irreverent, though, and it's sort of a yin and yang thing between us." Howard's own songwriting credits include multiple cuts with Miranda Lambert, including "Heart Like Mine," "Bring Me Down" and "Famous In A Small Town."

In addition to 'CYE, the show is heard on Empire's KRTY/San Jose and El Dorado's KSNI & KSLY/Santa Maria, CA. "The feedback has been great," says KNSI & KSLY OM/PD Dave Daniels. "I can't tell you how many times listeners have made a point to say so. Aaron and Travis are fun and well-informed because both are songwriters. And of course in sharing the stories they're also playing the recorded versions of the songs."

more markets, and Benward is joined by longtime friend and industry vet **Rob Dalton** in seeking affiliates. All inventory remains with the stations until the affiliate base is broad enough for national ad sales. "For now it's about building awareness," Benward says.

Howard is sure that time will come. "Once you hear the story behind your favorite song, you hear it in a completely different way," he says. Programmers needn't worried that the show is too inside for average listeners. "When Nashville came on TV, [this concept] became a little easier to do," Daniels says. "That's a theatrical representation of what goes on behind the scenes and people are interested. There is one of these stories behind every song and record. If you can share that content with your audience, you're drawing them closer to your station. You're reinforcing their love for the format and your station by telling them what it's all about."

#### **Holding Out For Heroes**

When it comes to side events that raise money for **St. Jude Children's Research Hospital**, the challenges that come up usually don't involve months of training and tests of physical endurance. But in 2012, St. Jude partnered with the Country Music Marathon and Half Marathon in Nashville and got a handful of radio stations involved to create teams of St. Jude Heroes, raise money, and run. April 25 will mark the effort's fourth year, with more than 25 radio stations participating, and St. Jude has issued a challenge for more.

**WPUR/Atlantic City** midday personality **Georgia** is leading a team for the first time this year, thanks to her St. Jude rep, Marli. "I'm not a runner, but it didn't take much to convince me," she says. "I'm fairly in shape, I go to the gym on a regular basis, I've just never gotten into running. Marli said it's a good way for me to help raise more money for St. Jude and any time someone gives me a way to do that, I say yes." She says listener reaction



has been good, and she'll host some happy hours where potential teammates can learn more and join her team.

**WFMB/Springfield, IL** morning co-host **Andi Brooks** has done half marathons before so when her St. Jude reps asked her,



she was immediately on board. "I've been to the hospital a couple of times," Brooks says, "and it's an amazing place, so I was sold." Brooks adds not being close to Nashville makes it tougher to get people to join Andi's Dream Team, but fundraising incentives that allow participants to earn airfare and hotel stays for race weekend help. "Once we started working together and find ways to raise that money together, it's easier than we

actually thought it would be," she says.

ALSAC St. Jude Specialist/Radio Development **Jessica Turri** says if station staffers will hear her out, it's not hard to convince them to get involved. "It's not just a full or half marathon, we have

them to get involved. "It's not just a full or half marathon, we have a 5K option, too," she says. "That's the most popular route for our radio and music industry teams. You have the same finish line as the half and full marathon runners, so you still get that festive experience." She says it's not uncommon to have a mix of teammates, some running the full marathon, some walking or running the half, and some doing the 5K, and all the fundraising options and incentives are the same.

Capitol's **Mickey Guyton** puts an industry spin on the artist interview:

One of the best moments on my radio tour was when we had one more station to see in Colorado. [Brian Taylor at KCCY/Colorado Springs] really wanted to see me but he and his family were moving into their new home that day – so we gave them a housewarming party. We brought barbeque to their house. His sweet family was nailing stuff on the walls. They had a "No shoes in the house" rule ... and that day

I had decided to wear my white-and-yellow banana socks. So here I am, singing in the kitchen of a house that didn't have much furniture in it yet, wearing my banana socks.

My favorite road companion is my dog Charlie. He's a little ragamuffin and I take him everywhere with me. He's a little rough around the edges, not the cutest thing. But he shows everybody love and everybody loves him.

I'd love to have dinner with Dolly Parton. I grew up listening to her and watching her movies. She seems like such a cool person who would make me feel right at home. I would ask her to cook for me but if that didn't work out, I'd eat pizza because it's my favorite food.

I like to call my music "thinking, therapy country." It's about the experiences I've had in my 20s. I write from the heart. I know I'm not the only person who goes through these experiences, so people hearing them can relate.


I wish I had written "The House That Built Me." I was driving back home in Texas, that song came on the radio and I wailed. It is so true to my life right now, growing up and moving from home and seeing my family get older. Seeing myself getting older and how all these things you go through in life make you who you are. I could cry just talking about that song.

I have to have my favorite perfume with me on the road. It's called Éclat d'Arpège by Lanvin. And I cannot go without my eyelashes. There's no trick to getting them on right. I've glued my eyes closed before.

**Being an artist is** such a narcissistic thing. I don't like talking about myself. I love calling my friends back home, hearing them talk about their lives.

**My home is Texas, but** Nashville is one of the most amazing cities ever. There's so much to do. It's such a progressive city, yet still conservative and people still have values. I love that.







"It's a great opportunity for stations to engage with their listeners while helping St. Jude," says Turri. "It's great bonding with their listeners, to train together and then celebrate with this fun weekend in Nashville."

The fundraising counts like any other side event a station might do throughout the year, and there are incentives to help get the whole team to Nashville for the race. Team captains get free airfare and hotel stay for race weekend when their teams raise \$10,000. Getting the team past \$20,000 adds another airfare and hotel room, which can be used for another team member, friend or family member or saved for later. Individual fundraisers can earn their hotel rooms and airfare at the gold and platinum fundraising levels (see all the levels and individual incentives here).

#### MY TUNES: MUSIC THAT SHAPED MY LIFE

The **Oak Ridge Boys' Joe Bonsall** discusses his most influential music.

1. Neil Diamond at the Grand Ole Opry House, 1976: Diamond was in his prime. He did about a 2 1/2 hour show. His 12-string guitar sounded like it could knock down a building.

**2. Elvis in Buffalo, NY, 1972:** In the late '60s when I was living in Buffalo, Richard Sterban and I were in a gospel group called The Keystones. He left to

sing with JD Sumner and the Stamps, who backed up Elvis. In 1972 Elvis came to Buffalo and Richard was up there singing oohs and aahs behind Elvis. The greatest thing I had ever seen in my life.

**3. Bruce Springsteen in Cleveland, early '80s:** The Oaks were playing in Cleveland and Springsteen was going to play there the next night. We all stayed over and went to see The Boss. When he came out and the spotlight hit him, he went into "Thunder Road" with just him and his harmonica before the band came in. I was in tears, I was so moved.

4. The Oak Ridge Boys in Wilmington, Delaware, 1969: I was with The Keystones and we opened for the Oak Ridge Boys. They were the coolest, hippest group, taking gospel music to levels unheard of. That night I became friends with Duane Allen and William Lee Golden. Who would've thought I would join the group in 1973? And Richard Sterban had already joined in 1972.


**5. Johnny Cash at the Canadian Expo in Toronto, early '70s:** It was pouring rain during the show. Cash never wavered. He walked out on this ramp that came out into the audience. His hair was all down in his face and he was out there in the rain, singing. I'll never forget it.


•A highly regarded song or album you've never heard: Vivaldi's "Four Seasons." I don't listen to classical music a lot.

An "important" piece of music you just don't get: Rap or hip-hop. Didn't think it would last, but it's become an art form.

sue. "We liked the smallness," he says of his decade-plus run with McCoy & Associates. "The fact that it was more individualized, that we weren't in a big room with everyone else, that we were allowed to have our own studio."

Though the 2014 CMA remotes had a more intimate feel, the pipe-and-drape approach isn't everyone's preference. "We don't play a lot of music in our morning show, and the big rooms are so noisy it hinders what we do," Daniels continues. "It's the most important reason why we do it. If we had to do a big room, we wouldn't go." He adds that even the artists seem to enjoy the difference. "They always say the same thing: 'It's quiet in here. Do you mind if I just stay in here and hang out?""

**Summer Lovin':** CMA and Premiere's decision to discontinue CMA Music Festival radio remotes a few years back created opportunity for another unofficial broadcast, as Bishop Media & Marketing's **Karyn Bishop** brought stations in for the event this past June. The impetus was radio, as PDs asked her to take up the June remotes mantle during CRS.

The point is to take advantage of a time when most artists are in town at once. "I don't want to step on any toes," she says. "I'm totally rogue. My main goal is to partner artists with radio to give an excellent interview, wonderful on-air content for the stations, and to let them talk to 40 great artists in three days. You usually can't get that many while you're sitting in your radio station."

The demand for that event is great enough that McCoy & Associates will be reprising its June remotes during CMA Music Festival after taking several years off.

Artists, managers and labels seem eager to connect with radio, regardless of who is running the remotes broadcast. "The artist quality has grown exponentially," Jackson says of his awards experiences. "We've gotten Miranda [Lambert], Florida Georgia Line, we've gotten Garth Brooks."

Daniels also sees improvement. "In the beginning, Sharla probably had four or five really good artists each day and then some of the baby acts," he says. "But every year it gets better. There are a few artists like Tim McGraw and Reba – those people just stop you in your tracks, no matter how long you've been in the industry."

For McCoy, last year's showstopper was Brooks. "The last shift on the last day, Garth Brooks pulled up in his pickup truck, walked up the steps and came right in," she says. "He wasn't on the artist booking sheet. He was gifting me, he was coming to celebrate my 20-year anniversary with me."

**While Not At:** If the artist rolls are largely similar, the biggest difference on-air may be as simple as semantics. "As a professional courtesy, there's a policy with my broadcasts that they're not allowed to say they're broadcasting at the CMA," McCoy says. "They're allowed to say they're broadcasting during – with a capital D – CMA Award show week. That's legit."

However the official remotes evolve – and whispers of a somewhat more inclusive ACM process have been heard – the unofficial versions aren't likely to move off their well-staked ground. Even if opportunity grows. "I have had many opportunities to make my remote double in size, and I refused to do it," McCoy admits. "I knew I could physically do a big broadcast, but what would be at stake is quality broadcasting. I like it to be laid back, fun and flexible, and all of that would be gone if I doubled in size."

Bishop adds that having more stations would decrease the time each gets with the artists. "It's an intimate setting," she explains. "We only get so much time with the artists so if I have more stations, they'll only get two or three minutes. I don't want anyone to be rushed."


