



Sandy Still Wreaking Havoc


"This is not a cleanup for a few weeks; this will be years." That's **WJVC/Nassau** PD **Phathead** offering a boots-on-theground assessment of Hurricane Sandy, one week later. Major challenges continue to confront Phathead, his staff and other stations in the region, both professionally and personally.

Power to 'JVC's studios wasn't fully restored until late Friday afternoon (11/2), which meant they spent the bulk of last week without access to their Nexgen computer system. "We'd been running all of our current music on an iPod regardless of category," he tells **Country Aircheck**. "Basically 50 songs repeating over and over." Before the power

came back, WJVC provided updates to listeners directly from the shack at its transmitter site. "That was about all we could do to stay on the air," he explains.

The personal toll goes beyond direct damage, which was thankfully light for the WJVC team. "Every person in our company is related to someone that lost a house, had a flooded house, a burned down house, or something of that nature," he says. "I grew up in Rockaway Beach where my parents still live – 44 years now. Their house and two cars were destroyed, but they were lucky. They are alive and well, living with me now. Homes around them burned to the ground. Neighbors were swept away."

Phathead and his two sisters fared better, though adversity continues. "We never even lost power where I live in eastern Long Island, but it's not the same story for so many others. And either every station is out of gas or, if they have gas, the lines are so long that they run out immediately and it's a three-hour wait to fill up. It's like living in a Hollywood movie; you can't actually believe this is happening."

Although **Atlantic City** took a direct hit from Sandy, **WPUR** and its staff suffered little if any damage, according to PD **Joe Kelly**. "We had a couple of people in our five-station group with mostly water damage. Nobody was injured; everybody can go back home."

From a technical standpoint, Kelly says 'PUR was fortunate. "We're in Northfield, about 15

minutes away from the shore. Our tower for Cat Country is actually in Atlantic City and near a bay. It received a lot of water but the damage was to our generator. We have backup tower sites and backup generators in our studios and at all our tower sites ... somebody thought ahead here."

On the air now, Cat Country is helping the recovery process. "We're concentrating on something we're calling 'Restore the Shore,' Kelly says. "We're working with different organizations to publicize all the collection locations and relief programs. We're even going out to a few of them ourselves."

WKMK/Monmouth PD **Marty Mitchell** is among the station's many staffers still without power. "Clients and listeners have offered a place to stay, shower, watch TV, hot meals and stay warm. The support has been


overwhelming," he says Mitchell, noting some staffers' homes have flooded.

The station stayed on the air throughout, running a full week on generators before power was restored. "One more day and we'd have all been off the air. It was difficult getting outside news. No cable, Internet or email services for most of the week. We focused on giving important info and playing music when we had time."

Mitchell's Long Island-based family members are working through the aftermath. "My younger brother Jonathan had four feet of water on the first floor of his two story home. His wife's car is totaled due to flooding. Other family members are still without power or just getting it restored."

The show's performance-heavy structure met with our group's approval. "It was just a three-hour feast of our finest," Turpin asserts. Chiang adds, "I never felt the show dragged at any time."

As to which performances stood out, the answers are as diverse as the artists. "Opening with **Jason Aldean**, **Eric**

Church and Luke Bryan was a good call," Lance Houston Matthews says. "Every woman in America was probably an inch from their TV screen Thursday night." James calls Little Big Town's "Pontoon" performance "visually stunning, with a very cool utilization of lighting and digital effects." Turpin adds, "I spent the whole song trying to figure out who thought up those boxes and how they got

the graphics to flow."

"Keith Urban and Zac Brown was my favorite," King says. "Loved Kelly Clarkson and Vince Gill, Tim McGraw, Taylor Swift and The Band Perry. This show could net the most No. 1 songs that debuted on the CMAs (there's one for your research department)." Thomas liked the Clarkson/Gill live

19/Interscope/Mercury's **Scotty McCreery** puts an industry spin on the artist interview.

I grew up listening to WQDR/Raleigh. It was and still is the only Country station to listen to back home. They pretty much dominate the Triangle area of North Carolina. Their staff supported me when I did small shows, long before I was ever on American Idol. When I was on the

show they called it "Scotty 94.7."

The first time I heard myself on the radio I had won Idol the day before and had to fly home to take an AP English exam. It was around midnight and we were driving through Garner heading to our house when 94.7 played my Idol finale single "I Love You This Big." It was pretty wild to hear it on the radio for the first time and be with my family, in my hometown, after being in Hollywood for so many months. It was priceless. I'll never forget the time we did a radio show concert at City Place in West Palm. We were with Sammy Cruise at WIRK. I think they were expecting 1,500 people, but the crowd was estimated at more than 8,000. The streets were packed and fans surrounded our bus. The police had to put me and my family in a cruiser and take us out the back way.

There's no place like home, but I love Boston... Quincy Market, Red Sox, Boston Harbor. My dad grew up north of there in southern Maine. The whole area is just beautiful. If I don't have my cell phone when I travel, I go insane. Gotta stay connected to my friends back home and my Twitter family.

The last purchase I made from Skymall was, well...
I've never actually bought one, but those Big Foot statues look pretty cool. I'd love to stick one in my backyard and surprise my dad. He loves all those Big Foot documentaries.

When there's downtime you'll find me playing Tiger Woods PGA Golf.


The best advice I ever got actually came from two different artists. I met both Garth Brooks and Lionel Richie in Las Vegas last spring. Garth told me I was smart to go to college and Lionel said, "When people build you up, remember to bring yourself back down."

performance better than the recorded version. "I'd love to hear her come with a solid country album that doesn't lean so pop," she says. "She has the voice and ability to do a straightforward country album that would blow everyone away."



Elsewhere in the show, Little Big
Town's wins (Single, Vocal Group) were
widely applauded. "Great to see them
finally get their CMA props with two awards," James raves.
"Couldn't happen to a nicer group of artists." Matthews
calls the Group acceptance, "One the funniest speeches
ever. Thank you, Jesus! Thank you fans and Jesus, thank
you Country radio and Jesus. LOL, I loved it! Proof that
persistence pays off."

Likewise, Eric Church's Album of the Year honor (Chief) brings cheers all around. "Now he has somewhere to hang his hat," Rivers says. "The genre has been more accepting of new styles and that has brought wider appeal to country." Thomas admits that the Album moment probably upset her neighbors. "I was so excited, my yelling was probably heard a couple of blocks away," she says. Matthews calls Church, "The coolest guy in country music. I was super excited to see him win Album of The Year and the fact that he summoned his inner-Springsteen, made me love him even more."

Production gets high marks. "My biggest issue with the CMAs in the past was always the sound quality, or the lack thereof," observes Chiang. "The producers obviously addressed it this year ... the sound was much better." And while Turpin heard


"a lot of pitchy-ness, dawg –maybe artists can't hear their ear monitors," Houston has a pretty good counter. "One of my friends came over to watch the show with us," he says. "He's not a country music fan, but he did say, 'I really like that they all actually sing on the Country awards shows."


Finally, the emotional bookend to the hosts' hilarity was provided by top winners **Blake Shelton** and **Miranda Lambert**. "Blake's acceptance speech for Song of the Year was so emotional, who couldn't hold back tears with Miranda?" King asks. James calls it, "The most touching and memorable moment of the evening." Adds Thomas, "Male, female, my dog ... we were all wrecked after they spoke." And Rivers liked Lambert's entire night. "Warm and real, showcasing the vitality of all that is country," he says. "Miranda came out and was so badass with 'Fastest Girl.' A half-hour later, she emotionally accepted the award with Blake for 'Over You.'"

KSOP/Salt Lake City PD **Deb Turpin** is also on the Miranda train, hailing the singer's Female Vocalist acceptance speech and its not to the other nominees: "Humble, yet some girl power attitude at the same time and so proud to be country!"

Pride seems to be a common sentiment following this year's show. "The CMAs make me so proud of our format and artists," Thomas says. "There's a lot of respect for the people who listen to country music. It's a chance for people who don't know what they're missing to get a look at what country looks and sounds like." Adds Turpin, "Who couldn't absolutely love this format?"

October PPM Scoreboard

More stations increased than decreased in October, however overall shares for Country decreased by 3.1% compared to September. Of the 73 subscribing stations posting a 1.0 share or higher, 36 increased, 29 decreased and eight were flat.

Three stations had their best-ever PPM month, led by Entercom's WPAW/Greensboro (10.8), which increased 1.5 shares from September, making it the format's highest gainer for the month. Other PPM-best shares include Empire's KRTY/San Jose improving 4.9-5.1 and Cumulus's **WNNF/Cincinnati**, gaining 2.5-2.9.

Clear Channel's **WMIL/Milwaukee** tied WPAW for highest Country share in October (10.8); 'MIL has now put up double-

digit shares in four consecutive months.
