Country Still Cares At St. Jude Seminar

The annual St. Jude Country Cares Seminar in Memphis took on a streamlined, two-day agenda last week (10/12-13) that still managed to be packed with sessions and activities for its hundreds of Country radio attendees. Events included a Halloween costume party on the roof of the event's host hotel, the Peabody, and the Angels Among Us dinner, which shifted to Thursday night from its traditional Saturday berth.

Honored with the dinner's namesake award, presented by **Alabama** frontman and *Country Cares* founder **Randy Owen**, EMI Nashville's **Brothers Osborne** also headlined the post-dinner performance. They were joined by songwriter **Lee Thomas Miller**, writer/artist **Kendell Marvel** and Owen, who closed the show with the Alabama staple "Angels Among Us." For that song, he invited up the more than 20 country artists in attendance.

Accepting their award, which recognized years of service to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, **TJ Osborne** said it was "an incredible honor, but it feels a little weird in some ways [because] both of us think the focus should be on the kids and the families." Later, he added, "Being able to use our microphones for something greater is a no brainer," and called St. Jude "one of the only things that seems too good to be true, and it is true." **John Osborne** added, "There are beautiful things in this world, and



St. Jude is among the top of them." As for the award, he said, "We've had a lot of achievements, but this is by far one of the most important, and one I will always hold dear to my heart."

During his performance, Miller said, "Anytime St. Jude calls, it's a 'yes.' There's no greater cause, no

greater organization." Many of the radio attendees – all from stations around the country who host annual fundraising radiothons for St. Jude or are considering doing so – agreed. During a lunchtime session on Friday, **KWEN/Tulsa** PD **Matt Bradley** spoke about his initial reluctance to host a radiothon when he first arrived at the station. "You're taught all the rules of programming, and everything about a radiothon goes against those rules," he said. But the immediate response he saw from listeners that first year quickly changed his mind. He said, "I encourage every programmer to have an open mind. Don't be Matt. (continued on page 8)

As has become its custom, the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame pulled out a few big surprises during last week's annual induction ceremony (10/11). Unannounced presenter Dolly Parton, and performers Eric Church, Kenny Chesney and Cody Johnson, were among those helping to induct Casey Beathard, Kix Brooks, Keith Urban, David Lee Murphy, Rafe Van Hoy and the late John Jarrard. The four-hour show also included a musical tribute to the late Jimmy Buffett from Will Kimbrough, and the presentation of the Frances Williams Preston Mentor Award to Bobby Bare. Q3 Drivetime Leaders

Following the release of the September Nielsen PPM monthlies, **Country Aircheck** has analyzed Q3 numbers to compile the stations with the leading cumes and shares in drivetime. Quarterly averages eliminate the wobbles that can be present at a daypart level on a month-to-month basis. All figures are Persons 6+.


Mornings: The Bobby Bones Show retains its place atop the cume rankings, with a total cume of 1,160,500 over 16 stations, down 15,700 from Q2. The top single-station morning show is also the CMA Large Market Personality winner, as KSCS/Dallas' Hawkeye In The Morning with Mark "Hawkeye" Louis and Michelle Rodriguez jumps from fourth to second overall with 267,100 listeners. WUSN/Chicago's Melissa McGurren and Austin Huff are the only other morning show to clear a quarter million listeners, placing third.

The Wakeup Call with Zuko & Kayla on WCOL/Columbus holds the largest morning drive share in the format for the second consecutive quarter, up 0.3 from Q2's 9.1. They edge WQIK/Jacksonville's Big Show with Robbie & John, with whom they were tied last quarter.

Afternoons: Women rule the afternoon airwaves in Country, as KKBQ/Houston's Lauren "Lo" Sessions reclaims the most-listened-

to crown in afternoon drive with a cume of 338,000 after slipping to second last quarter. An increase of 25,300 listeners helps KKGO/Los **Angeles' Christine Martindale** jump from sixth to second with a cume of 334,800. While only two stations cleared the quarter million cume hurdle in morning drive, eight did so in afternoons.

WCOL/Columbus' Brandon "Boxer" Nasby holds the afternoon share lead for the fourth straight quarter and jumps from an 11.3 to an even 12-share in the process, the largest afternoon share in the format in more than two years. **Kevin Lawrence**'s afternoon show on **WCTK**/ Providence lands in second with a 9.0 share. We are now years in, and I look forward to our radiothon more than any other thing. Jump in with both feet and do it."

After touring the hospital campus, and hearing stories from patients and their families, attendees were also offered breakout sessions designed to help them get the most out of their radiothons. At a discussion moderated by **KKBQ/Houston** PD **Travis Moon**, panelists shared their experiences and best practices. Moon suggested that stations not pre-promote their radiothons in advance "because it's an emotional two days for your

listeners, and you don't want to burn them out before you get on the air."

While talking about childhood cancer is inherently sad, during his station's annual event **KUPL/Portland** APD/MD **Danny Dwyer** said they turn the phone bank area where volunteers are taking listener calls into "one giant party. We bring in so much food our volunteers look forward to it."

WSIX/Nashville midday personality Brooke Taylor said that after an experience at her first radiothon of focusing too much on the operational aspects, including adhering closely to a best practices manual provided by St. Jude staff, she now focuses on being a "human" rather than a "radio personality" in order to connect with her listeners. "Listen to the story song, feel the feelings," and express them on the air, she suggested.

Provided by hospital staff, story songs intercut familiar country tracks with audio of patient families sharing their journeys. As the MD loading those songs into the station's scheduling software, Dwyer resists the temptation to listen to them in advance, so that when hearing them on-air he can respond with genuine surprise and emotion.

KMDL/Lafayette PD **Jude Walker** got emotional talking about how his own healthy son inspires his work with St. Jude, describing how he goes into his son's room and kisses him goodbye before heading in to start the radiothon on his morning show each year.

Among other tips, Moon, a former employee of St. Jude's fundraising and awareness arm, ALSAC, suggested limiting distractions for the onair staff, such as salespeople wandering in and out, so the talent can concentrate on the emotional aspects of the radiothon. He also advised stations not to get anxious if the phone bank isn't consistently busy "because one moment can make the entire hour" when a poignant radiothon segment hits the right note with listeners.

During the seminar's opening session, ALSAC CEO **Richard Shadyac Jr.** told attendees that Country Cares' all-in fundraising total has crested

\$950 million. At the closing "Meet the Patients" session, he added, "I hope
you know your power. Your listeners trust you, and I hope you use your
power and tell them our mission is as urgent today as it was when **Danny Thomas** founded this place" in 1962. Speaking about how St. Jude shares
it protocols and treats patients from around the world, where survival rates
are much lower than in the U.S., he added, "We have a moral imperative to
change the world. That's what I want you to tell your listeners."

In addition to the Thursday night dinner performers, artists who toured the hospital and mingled with Country radio attendees included Matt Stell, Chris Lane, Dylan Marlowe, James Barker Band, Tiera Kennedy, Tigirlily Gold, Ian Munsick, Jordan Fletcher, Alex Hall, Catie Offerman, Harper Grace, Dylan Schneider, George Birge, HunterGirl, Noah Thompson, Chase Matthew, Tyra Madison and Neon Union's Leo Brooks. The Avett Brothers' Bob Crawford, the parent of a St. Jude patient, made a return visit as a keynote speaker.






