

# **Opryland Hotel Reopens**

The 2,881-room **Opryland Hotel** reopened today after May's historic flooding caused an estimated \$285 million in damage and forced a relocation of the *Grand Ole Opry* until September 28. Gaylord's Classic Country **WSM-AM** moved to its transmitter site in Bretnwood while the nation's largest non-casino hotel underwent a six-month restoration. Parts of the resort was submerged in more than 10 feet of water, and the adjacent Opry Mills Mall remains shuttered and in litigation with insurance companies. The hotel is hosting four conventions today and rooms are sold out for the weekend. More than 1,700

#### My Tunes: Music That Shaped My Life



Citadel's **KUBL/Salt Lake City** PD **Ed Hill** discusses his most influential songs, albums or concerts:

**1. Bob Seger, L.A. Forum, 1978:** The *Stranger In Town* tour. A real rock and roll show: Loud, proud and rocking. "It was Hollywood nights in those Hollywood hills." 'nuff said.

**2. Garth Brooks, Columbia, SC, 1992:** Garth was at the height of awareness during the *Ropin' The Wind* tour. He closed the show with "The Dance." I hung out with him backstage for an hour. Awesome. Sincere. A real, humble

and kind superstar. I was all-in with Garth. A true believer.

**3. Pink Floyd, The Wall, 1980, Los Angeles:** I hopped out of the car and ran across the freeway to make the beginning of the show. Everyone in the crowd was stoned and/or taking psychedelics. Saw them perform the concert in one of only four cities in the world. It was a spectacle; completely absorbing.

**4. Bruce Springsteen, Born To Run:** "Jungleland." "Tenth Avenue Freeze Out." I cruised around looking for the same adventures and experiences that Bruce sang about. I felt his pain. His outsider status. His victories. Man, I was only 16 years old, but I could relate, ya know?

**5. Rolling Stones, Anaheim Stadium, 1978:** I sat five feet from the stage for the *Some Girls* tour. Peter Tosh opened, smoked dope onstage and said, "Smoke the herb." Then the Outlaws played. What a mix of music! And I hit Mick Jagger with a pair of shoes. He solicited that he wanted to be hit with our shoes, and everyone threw them at him. This was before the big stage shows. It was just the Stones, their energy and you.


**6. Eagles, L.A. Forum, The Long Run Tour, 1980:** They opened with "Hotel California" against a backdrop of the album cover. The Blues Brothers (John Belushi and Dan Akroyd) sang and danced. The real Hotel California was Camarillo State Mental Hospital in my hometown of Camarillo. Don Henley's brother spent time there. I used to sell beer there to the "wet brains" (recovering alcoholics). Camarillo State had a huge alcohol rehab joint, and we would drive around and sell a can of beer for five bucks! That was in 1976 and we made bank.

• A highly regarded song or album you've never heard: The Band, *Music From Big Pink*. I have never listened to an entire Beatles album. Forget the Beatles. Give me Frank Zappa.

• An "important" piece of music you just don't get: Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band.

• An album you played or listened to incessantly: Lou Reed, Rock N Roll Animal. Pink Floyd, Dark Side Of The Moon. Bruce Springsteen, The River.

• One obscure or non-country song everyone should listen to right now: Joe Hisaishi, "Summer" from the Beat Takeshi movie *Kikujiro*. It's an instrumental – very moving.



"Knockout punches by Zac Brown Band/Alan Jackson and Jason Aldean/Kelly Clarkson," Wilde continues. "We immediately dropped the latter into medium rotation. Paisley was hot, too. Kid Rock? Nobody plays that song. Where was the duet with Kracker instead?!"

"I loved the show and thought Brad and Carrie were wonderful, playful and funny," says KIXZ/Spokane PD **Paul Neumann**. "I didn't get the Kid Rock song, though. Why, when there are so many great real country artists that wouldn't get the time slot? Sometimes it seems we have to be more rock

and roll to be cool. Paying tribute to our heritage with Little Jimmy Dickens, Loretta Lynn and Brad's song went well. I love that we haven't forgot where we've come from."

As for Gwyneth Paltrow, Neumann says "I thought she did a good job and the nurturing from Vince was priceless, but when she said in the press that she really didn't want to pursue a singing career in country it leaves me flat. I see so many wonderful artists who are so talented and want to contribute to the format that I want them to have the shot instead of creating a promo for a movie release only. But I have to admit, I was jacked up when she left me a message thanking me for playing her song because I'm the littlest guy in the business and she's Gwyneth."

KIIM/Tucson's **Buzz Jackson**: "I thought generally the right people won, though I was thinking that maybe B&D would win one final Duo award. Miranda, Blake and Brad 100% deserved everything they won, and I though Brad's performance of his next single was great. Easton Corbin should've won New Artist, but ZBB deserved it, too."

"Blake winning was just what Warner Music Nashville needed to continue the momentum they have going so far this year, KBWF/San Francisco PD Mike Krinik says. "And Miranda has finally gotten a few items to put on her mantel at home – Columbia has got to be really celebrating (still) since it seems like it's taken her and them six or seven years to really break her. Good for Miranda and them!"

KEEY/Minneapolis PD Gregg Swedberg thought "it was a very well-paced and fun show, with a couple misses. The Loretta tribute was pretty awesome, but the real highlight for me was the previously unheard 'This Is Country Music' by Brad Paisley. I am sending hourly demands to Arista until they free the studio version of that to us. That's the best new song I've heard on a CMA show since Alan did "'Where Were You.' Brad was also so gracious when he won Entertainer and shows just what a complete class act he is. If you've known him for any period of time, you were right there with him up there. Ended the night on a fabulously high note.


