SXM's Alan, Banks Do The Dance

Here's a little-known fact about **Cody Alan**: While living in Texas and working for **KPLX/Dallas**, he took two-step dancing lessons.

So he knows what he's talking about when

later after welcoming her first child. Before that, Banks had been handling the show solo since the mid-May departure of 17-year morning

personality Storme Warren.



Since joining forces, the two have been finding their groove as co-hosts. "It feels really good," he says of their partnership. "The past couple of months we've been learning each other; how to dance. It's kind of like a two-step, where you try to figure out which way the other person's going and where what you want to say fits in – just finding that groove."

Banks joined SXM in 2021 following time with Cumulus/Atlanta, WNGC/Athens, GA and WWKA/Orlando. She says the partnership has been "a breath of fresh air," and that she was comforted during her maternity leave to know "the show was left in good hands." She also says there were no "Sunday scaries" upon her return. "I wasn't worrying about what would happen or how it would all go. I just knew that we would end up flowing well together."

Adds Alan, "There was a nice trust right from the beginning. It felt like we were already pals, [so] it was just a matter of figuring out that consistency, that daily rhythm." He adds of their dynamic, "If I'm the quarterback throwing the ball, Macie's catching it. She's the Travis Kelce with whatever she's thrown, and that is hard to find in radio. It's special when it happens."

Last April, SiriusXM announced that

Black To The Future

Last month, longtime iHeartMedia WKSJ/Mobile, AL PD/

afternoon co-host **Bill Black** announced he would wind down his 45-year radio career at the end of January. **Country Aircheck** caught up with him to look back at his accomplishments and what lies ahead.

CA: You've spent more than two-thirds of your career at one radio station, how did that happen?

BB: I had always been a big fan of 'KSJ from the days of **Ken Johnson**'s ownership and great talent like **Bill Dotson** and **Wayne Gardner**.



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When I got the job, I just hoped they'd let me stay for a while – it ended up being 31 years. It's hard to find this kind of longevity in any job; either a place gets disillusioned with you, or you get disillusioned with the job. But this has been everything I hoped it would be and more.

What are some of the highlights?

The fact that I brought St. Jude in as a big partner for the station is something I'll be proud of forever. We did motorcycle rides for 15 years in a row. We've done mini-concerts as well as radiothons. All those things hold a special place in my heart.

The high mark was probably Kenny Chesney's Flora-Bama-Jama concert in 2014. We put 40,000 people on the beach and another 300 boats in the water. It was a lot of hard work for the staff, and to see it all come to fruition was astounding. That was my Woodstock moment.

You became known for your "Rep Roundups." How did those come about?

Nashville has always been very good to 'KSJ, so years ago I decided to give back. We invited all the reps in for a weekend. They had to pay for their own travel and accommodations, but we treated them to golf, dinners and some kind of excursion. The one rule was no one was allowed to talk business or pitch records; it was all about having a good time on the Gulf. We used to take them deep sea fishing, but after a couple of the reps got seasick, we came up with the "beach Olympics," playing silly games for prizes. I wish I had time to do one more, but that's a part of my legacy that will always make me smile. Those were great times that cemented great friendships.

You already live on the beach. What does retirement look like?

I don't know the answer to that. I've been living here for more than two years now, commuting to Mobile and working from home on Thursdays and Fridays, and it was just time to not make that drive anymore. I'm leaving the station in a good spot. I've got some great friends and associates here on the island, and I'm probably going to try and do something with one of them just to kill a little time so I'm not driving my wife crazy sitting at home.

You mention WKSJ being in a good spot. How has the station been so successful for so long?

WKSJ is entrenched in the marketplace and is partnered with all the big events here. We've had one direct challenger since I've been here, and it lasted about 18 months. You can beat a heritage station, but it takes time, effort and money, and the heritage station must make mistakes. I've got a staff of people that work their asses off and that's what it takes. If you're dealing with people who are just clock watchers - coming in to do an airshaft and leaving – you're not going to win. If you've got people who are competitive and care about the product and the station, then you'll find ways to win.

What are you going to miss the most?

Without a doubt the people. The day-to-day moments with staff are the things I'll miss more than anything else. Reach Black here.






ON THE RECORD: SON OF A SENATE

"Forgive me, I'm a little nervous," began Stoney Creek's **Jelly Roll** at last week's (1/11) Senate fentanyl hearing. "During the time I've been given to share my testimony here, somebody in the United States will die of a drug overdose, and it is almost a 72% chance that, during those five minutes, it will be fentanyl-related."

Other highlights included: "I've attended more funerals than I care to share with ... this committee. I could sit here and cry for days about the caskets I've carried of



"It's important for me to tell you all I'm not here to defend the use of illegal drugs. And I also understand the paradox of my history as a drug dealer standing in front of this committee ... I was a part of the problem. I am standing here now as a man [who] wants to be a part of the solution.

"I'm here to tell you all that fentanyl is going to make the Sackler family look like [saints]. And I want to let you all sit with that for a second. It is time for us to be proactive and not reactive. We were reactive with crack. We were reactive with opioids, and y'all are taking the first step at somebody in the Senate finally being proactive.

"At every concert I perform, I witness the heartbreaking impact of fentanyl. I see fans grappling with this tragedy ... [seeking] solace in music and hope that their experiences won't befall others. These are the people I'm here to speak for, y'all. These people crave reassurance that their elected officials actually care more about human life than they do about ideology and partisanship."

Banks would also host a midday show in addition to her morning duties, succeeding Kellie Pickler. But with the new pairing with Alan, she is instead fully focused on her upgraded role in mornings, with Ashley Till currently handling middays.

Alan had the challenge of following SXM fixture Warren, but the combination of a several month gap between Warren's departure and his own arrival helped cut down on the comparisons. "People were just ready to find out what was next," he says of his transition. And while Alan appreciates the heritage that was built up on the channel over the years, he also knew he'd have to make his own way. "I couldn't rely on the past," he says. "It has to be about the future, with all due respect to the legacy that was built. I've got to think about where I'm going with this. What do [Macie and I] have together that the audience can love?'"

The show's benchmark features include "two truths and a liar," developed by their producer, **Nick Coulson**, where two of the team members reveal something truthful about themselves, and the third makes up a story. Banks says the bit has helped the audience get to know them better. They've also added a news feature to the show, "Highway Hot Headlines," featuring what Alan calls "topline" news from the world of country music. "Really being that source for information when it comes to the country world was part of the goal here; for people to look to us whenever any country story breaks," he says.

For Banks, being based in Nashville and "part of the country music culture" brings with it a measure of both industry respect and artist recognition, since she and Alan are face-to-face with talent on a regular basis, something she says helps artists "share stories on the air with us that they might not share otherwise."

Both personalities cut their teeth on terrestrial radio, and Alan continued to work in radio syndication at CMT until late 2021. Satellite radio is "a

little back to the future for me," he says. "We're doing radio in a way that I grew up loving: real interaction, real music discovery, great chat breaks that are informative and entertaining." It reminds him of his years with KPLX. "Everyone is engaged in what we're doing, and it's exciting," he says. "I spent years doing radio different ways, and certainly have lots of experience voice tracking. You're not quite as in touch with the listeners that way."

Banks feels the same, saying, "People would be surprised to know that from the business side of things, terrestrial radio is a little more buttoned up than satellite. In terrestrial, we were always so worried about ratings, whereas here, we know subscribers are listening. We know they're subscribed to SiriusXM as a whole. So we get to have fun and genuinely develop a relationship and a friendship. The listeners feel that connection."

After ending the syndicated radio portion of his work with CMT, Alan says he only wanted to do radio again if the opportunity was fun, impactful and supportive of his CMT commitments. "SiriusXM embraced the idea of me being on other platforms," he says. "Likewise, the CMT people were very excited when SiriusXM came along because there are great opportunities to cross-pollinate." He'll attend Luke Bryan's Crash My Playa festival in Mexico this week, for example, and cover it for CMT while also doing live breaks for The Highway.

With SiriusXM having vacated its longtime home at Nashville's Bridgestone Arena late last year, the show is currently broadcasting from studios at Margaritaville ahead of moving into the AT&T "Batman building" later this month. Banks says, "We've put on the hard hats and looked at the space – a big new studio built out with a stage. It's awesome." The new digs are especially convenient for Alan, with the CMT building across the street.

As they await that move, Alan and Banks continue to fine-tune their show and their partnership. "We're gelling and we're learning that two-step together pretty well, and it will only get better," Alan says. "But for the first couple months, it's been pretty seamless and remarkable."

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
