"We want every session to have at least one 'a-ha' moment; a takeaway that can help someone improve their revenue or ratings, or enhance their career." So says CRB Exec. Dir. **Bill**Mayne of the thinking behind next year's agenda, released today. (View it at the new www.

crb.org.) Below, Country Aircheck asks the folks in the know for a deeper look at three key panels. And remember, the limited-time \$399 registration is the

WKKT/Charlotte OM/PD **Bruce Logan** is the Agenda Committee pro behind the programming-focused panel **Superstars: Who Is The New Core And How Are They Driving The Format.** 

"We just got approval last week to enlist a research company to roll all the name recognition – Q Scores, if you will – into one brand listing and compare it with song research results and actual airplay information," Logan explains. "I think we'll find that some of the biggest acts in the format may not be the ones delivering the biggest hits."

Logan has some thoughts about the disconnect he expects the research to find. "A lot of stations went a long time without research when the economy tanked," he says.



"When stations got their money back, many were shocked to see how quickly, for instance, the Zac Brown Band were seen as superstars. In the past, it would take a long time to get to that level, but they got there in a few short songs. You see the same thing with Darius Rucker, Sugarland and others. And while you don't want to focus on this, if somebody is up, then somebody else

"We really wanted to address what has changed in the day to day jobs of four successful people in our business," Trapane says, citing KKBQ/Houston OM/PD Johnny Chiang, KBEQ/ Kansas City PD/morning host Mike Kennedy, Mercury/ Nashville VP/Promotion **Damon Moberly** and Valory SW rep Miranda Williams.

"We may think we do, but I'm not sure anybody really understands what the other guy does," Gale says. "And whatever you thought you knew or if you did know, it has probably changed completely in the last year to 18 months.

"If there was little more understanding, radio people might realize that a return call, when you're a promoter, is such a big deal. On the other side, a radio programmer is probably doing two-and-a-half jobs they weren't doing last year."

Gale points to Chiang as a perfect example. "You can't get to that guy," he says. "His cluster has him in charge of this new station he's putting on and he's almost unreachable. But he's not to be blamed, he should be applauded. His company believes in him enough to give him this important new job."

And workday challenges, while very different, are no less taxing on the label folks. Gale explains, "The biggest frustration as regional, and it's the same one I had, was that the only answer you don't want to give your boss is, 'They didn't call me back. I don't know, I haven't heard from them.' That's the worst answer you can give, but it represents reality."

Trapane concurs: "All [four panelists] have more on their plate in a given week that probably humanly possible."

Finally, we turn back to Mr. Mayne for the details on **Show** Me The Money: The Economics Of The Radio And Record **Industry.** "The concept is, for the first time ever, to bring in a top label financial manager, a top artist business manager and a top radio station manager to diagram how the money flows all the way down the line from gross to net," Mayne says. "For a label, you'll take a \$10.99 album sale and run it all the way down to the company net. For the station, it'll be an ad package and how that drills down to the bottom line. And for an artist, same thing – record revenue, touring, publishing and endorsements peeled back to what the artist may actually see.

"The record company example has been done during Leadership Music for years. What's unique about this is it's the first time you'll have these three participants together showing how it flows. On an individual basis, if you're a PD and aspire to being a GM, these are concepts you need to have. If you're a VP/ Promotion and want to move up to GM or to running a label, you need to understand this.

"This is not a boring economics lecture," Mayne says. "This is a look at the hard-hitting reality that will help you do better business and understand things at a level that can advance your career. Every time I've seen these kinds of numbers presented, you look around the room and can see the jaws drop."

# **June PPM Scoreboard**

Here are the **Arbitron** PPM share and cume figures for June (May 27-June 23) at 58 stations, generally with a 1.0 or better. Gainers led decliners 29-24, with five stations unchanged. The 127 stations reporting cume collectively reached 32,984,100 listeners, a new PPM record, the sixth straight increase and 10.9% above the Holiday '09 period. Of those 127, cume gainers led decliners 77-50 (60.6% up).

Among the highlights: Three stations moved up to No. 1: WYCD/Detroit, KEEY/Minneapolis and KYGO/Denver. The latter two set station share records, as did WPOC/Baltimore, KWJJ/Portland, KKGO/Los Angeles (in Riverside), KNCI/Sacramento, KFKF/Kansas City. The largest one-month gains (1.1 shares) were posted by KEEY, KWJJ and WGAR/Cleveland.

Seven stations delivered their best-ever cumes in their home markets including KEEY, KYGO, WPOC, KWJJ, KNCI, KSOP-FM/Salt Lake City and KFKF.

Hitting streaks: WUBL/Atlanta's 6+ share is up five straight months, while KEEY is up four straight. KEEY's cume is up six straight sweeps, as is KASE/Austin in San Antonio.

Legend: A "+" indicates a Classic Country oulet, a "^" designates Country stations in the same market owned by a single operator, a "t" indicates a tie and a "\*" indicates a record high showing for the station in that particular category.
