Country's Central Service System

As a format, Country is second to none when it comes to community service, but that commitment isn't accidental and has no room for complacency. Country Aircheck reached out to the best of the best - this year's NAB Marconi Country Station of the Year nominees (CAT 7/18), including winner **KYGO/Denver** (CAT 9/27) – for tips, thoughts and best practices that helped them earn recognition. Accolades aren't the point, of course, but even the best format in the business can find ways to improve.

Own It: A true service mindset has to start at the top. "We are fortunate at Bonneville to have owners and leaders who



empower us to use our stations for their intended purpose – to serve the community,' says KYGO PD

"Our signal is used to better our community whenever possible, whether that's a full-scale radiothon, a smaller onair promotion benefiting a local charitable cause or

rallying around a local family for a one-time need."

Recognizing community connection as more than a mandate goes hand-in-hand with that organizational commitment. "Aside from the fact that the FCC grants our license on the condition of serving the public interest, we also feel it is essential for our properties to be as involved in the community as possible," says KILT/Houston PD Chris Huff. "It has almost become trite at this point, but listeners want more than just a jukebox from their favorite radio station...they want to feel involved and know that the


One Week With: Agent Brian Hill

Rebel Engine's Stephanie Quayle discusses her most influential music:

Dolly Parton: With only her name, the world lights up. I want to bring that kind of joy into the world. She's a business woman with the greatest heart.

Reba: Like Dolly, she is loved by the world from song, stage and screen. I relate to her love of horses and how she grew up, and I aspire to

be like her. With a smile and a smirk, she makes everyone feel right at home in her presence.

Joni Mitchell's Court And Spark: I was introduced to this album during my early 20s, and it was a defining time in my life. My mom first introduced me to Joni's music with the album *Turbulent Indigo*, but Court And Spark shook my soul. I get lost in her lyrics, each painting such vivid imagery.

Bonnie Raitt live: Watching her fingers slide across the fret board, each song tearing you to shreds, the highs the lows. Inspiring, heartfelt and one the coolest people I've ever had the opportunity to tell how awesome I think they are.

Sheryl Crow's Tuesday Night Music Club: I wore it out; everything about this album is perfect. It hit at a time when I was finding my way through the "star-making machinery" early on. She's made her own land through her sound and song on her terms. This album is timeless and takes me right to where I was in my life finding my way.

Highly regarded music you've actually never heard: Cardi B's Invasion Of Privacy.

co-worker Mitch Rose, we are charged with doing the impossible and making it look easy," Hill explains. "We negotiate contracts and deals of all kinds on behalf of clients. Primarily live concert dates, but also merch, TV, special event hosting, private parties and deals that involve transitioning to other disciplines."

Beyond representing his roster of artists, Hill and other agents

work territorially in booking tours. "My region is the Midwest," he says. "From North Dakota, east to Wisconsin, south to Missouri and west to Kansas for all CAA country clients in stadiums, arenas, theaters and casinos. Private dates, festivals, clubs and special events are booked by others at the company."

Hill's typical day starts at 5:45am with breakfast and lunch-making for his four children as his wife Steffany gets ready for her day. His 30-mile commute to CAA's downtown office typically takes 75 minutes and gets him to the SunTrust



building by 8:30. He works out three times a week in the office gym with a trainer, who is also a budding recording artist (2 Black Dogs/Sony ATV's Holden James). "Every day I try, and mostly fail, to get home for a 6pm dinner with the family," he says. "I'm lucky if that happens three times a week, including weekends, I'm sad to say. I try to make up for it by being present and prescient Friday through Sunday."

Monday: Hill began his sample week reviewing final ticket counts from the weekend before navigating the "nonstop landslide" of incoming and outgoing calls with the help of his assistant, Karen Schillinger. From there, he worked on routing for a number of 2020 tours, including EYB, Lewis, Rice, Home Free, Martina McBride and Willie Nelson. He met a childhood friend who was in town for dinner and then attended *Whiskey Jam*, which CAA sponsors. Filmore, Niko Moon, Madison Kozack, Carly Pearce and EYB performed. Hill headed home about 10:45pm.

Tuesday: "Lather, rinse, repeat," he says of his start, which segued to the 9:30am routing meeting he runs for all the company's agents. A meeting with Rice and his management team tackled priorities for next year. "It's time to capitalize on

years of hard work we've put in with him in building a touring foundation." He had lunch at The Palm with Triple 8's Bruce Kalmick and fellow CAA agent/Rice co-RA Meredith Jones, where they saw "the real mayor of Nashville, Palm hostess Rae Krenn." An afternoon of phone and email triage expired when he met Blind Copy Creative owner (and radio vet) Nada Taha for drinks to discuss her work with a number of artists. On the way home, he stopped at Whole Foods where, among his purchases, he picked up sushi he ate in the parking lot for dinner. Three of four kids were asleep when he got home, and he and Steffany watched an episode (or three) of Narcos before falling asleep.

Wednesday: Added to typical tasks was a meeting with Staind guitarist Mike Mushok, who recently opened the Six String Grill at Patriot Place in Foxboro, MA. The discussion was split between booking bands for the venue and Staind's ongoing rehearsals for their first tour in six years. Lunch was with a new artist and potential client, and Hill left the office at 4:30pm for a full runthrough of Staind's set before taking the band to that night's Nashville Predators hockey game.

Thursday: Hill was up at 4:30am to catch a 6:30 flight to Erie, PA for EYB's tour-opening show with Chris Young. "As always, I researched a local non-chain joint for lunch," he says. "I went to The Wharf, sat at the bar and ate a good lunch before going back to the hotel to roll calls and emails." After attending soundcheck, dinner backstage and the show, he had a drink with the band on their bus. "I adamantly and successfully rebuffed [EYB manager] George Couri's invitation to go for drinks in the lobby before bed," he says.

Friday: A 6am flight took Hill to Louisville for the opening night of Staind's tour. They were co-headlining the *Louder Than Life Festival*, which also featured Slipknot, Guns 'N' Roses and Disturbed. "Staind were flawless, and it was also the best peoplewatching this side of CMA Music Fest," Hill says. "There were more women than I thought and more black t-shirts than I've ever seen in one place. I stuck out like a fly in a bowl of buttermilk." After the show, he left for Nashville in a one-way rental car, arriving home at 1:30am Saturday. "The week was drama-free," he says. "A welcome rarity. Might not be great for print, but it was great for me." Reach Hill here.

station cares just as much about their community as they do."
But how do you balance the call to serve the community with a need to drive ratings and revenue? "Radio is more than just being a faucet where listeners turn it on and country music comes out; you can get that in other places," says **KUBL/Salt Lake City** PD **Travis Moon**. "There's a nuance in doing important things that, in the moment, aren't about directly affecting ratings. Some things are important to do just to condition the station for a better


future. I call that 'aerating the lawn.'
We are all looking to build a lush platform where everything we do is enhanced.
Community service does just that."

Michel agrees that community service is the cornerstone of the mission statement. "The entertainment and music are built around that," he says, offering KYGO's extension of the idea



to its online presence. The station's full slate of community service initiatives and public affairs programming, contacts for local charities and ways to reach out for assistance are prominent on its website.

Must Be Present: Implementing or refreshing a station's efforts can be daunting, and knowing where to start is key. Michel recommends getting in touch with local government offices, political leaders and heads of local charity organizations to monitor their needs and keep a pulse on hot-button issues within a community. "We are fortunate to have a staff member in house dedicated to community outreach who attends local government and radio meetings to determine immediate needs and how we can spread those messages," he says. "In a world with everyone at a radio station wearing multiple hats, not every cluster can have someone dedicated to this, but making it a priority to attend meetings and discuss community issues regularly

AÎRCHECK OFF THE RECORD: CAYLEE HAMMACK



Caylee

Capitol's Caylee Hammack puts an industry spin on the artist interview:

I grew up listening to 98.7 WISK/Americus, GA. They were the first radio station to ever play my music. I had given them an a cappella version of "Amazing Grace" when I was about 15, and the DJ, Thurston Cleary, started playing it on Sunday mornings.

We played a radio show in Toronto until midnight and arrived at the airport the next morning at 4am to go through customs. It

seemed like a normal day for musicians, but we were flagged as suspicious because of our musical cases, assorted tattoos and (probably) overall grunginess. We were set to play the main stage at iHeartRadio Country Festival. The customs agent yelled at my drummer, Jeremy, and I, and our guitarist, Lance, got held back. I then puked in a trash can on the mad dash through the terminal. I remember holding back tears, just trying to catch my breath and wondering what in the world I had gotten myself into. We ended up getting to Austin just in time for the festival. It was the first time I had ever gotten to sing my song in an arena.

My dog is definitely my favorite road companion. She doesn't talk much, and we seem to enjoy the same types of music and audiobooks, so it works well.

I have so many people on the other side I'd love to meet, tell thank you to and say I'm sorry to. Bowie, Cash, Monroe and Joplin come to mind. But, the one person I would give anything to have dinner with one more time is my grandma. I want her chicken dressing the way only she could make it.

"Family Tree" is the Campbell's condensed cream of my family members and their antics. The inspiration found me at the slushy machine at the Chevron in my hometown (Ellaville, GA) when my sister was at the counter buying cigarettes – something mama and daddy have never been too keen on. When the man behind the counter said that they had sold out of Camel Crushes, I told her that she must've smoked all the Camels in the county last week. She rolled her eyes, but I pulled out my notepad and had to write it down.

I knew that song was where I needed to start this journey of telling my story. It's my way of welcoming folks into my music; welcome to the family.

I asked my parents to bring up Georgia-grown peaches and tomatoes for all of my team and friends after my Opry debut. It was the only way to do it!

I wish I'd written "Space Oddity" by David Bowie. It's one of those songs that makes you stop in your tracks when you hear it. It's this complex journey of an astronaut on the edge of discovery, and potential death, that no one has ever seemed to encapsulate into melody before.

My least favorite interview question is, "So, who are you dating?" My answer is always the music industry. That's the only man I want pining over me right now.

I'd be okay being stuck in New York City. Music seems to bring me to the Big Apple often, but sadly I never have off time to wander around the city. A perfect day in NYC for me would be to wander like a shadow in the Theatre district and watch the world walk by, and then to end the day with a Broadway show and a slice of cheesecake. I like to bask in the energy New York City seems to vibrate with.

I just binged Inside Bill's Brain: Decoding Bill Gates last night, and made quick business of watching the newest season of Disenchantment on late nights on the road. I love riveting documentaries and cleverly-created animations.

can lead to more impactful public affairs programming." Among other cluster programming, KYGO airs locally focused Mile High Magazine and Teen Talk segments and offers a Communities Connected podcast.

Huff and Moon suggest programmers keep their heads on a swivel throughout the year looking for opportunities to benefit a member of the local community. Moon keeps a calendar of community service items listeners are familiar with. Adds Huff, "It's less about a specific philosophy than the ability to adjust and adapt to specific needs, which can vary from promoting a local fundraiser to throwing all formatics aside to provide essential news and information during times of crisis. Our ability to react on short notice to ever-changing needs [sets radio apart]." For KILT, that included partnering with a car dealership this year to give away a truck to a local first responder.

Off The Bench: Efforts including Country Cares for St. Jude Kids and other radiothons have become Country radio benchmarks. While those nationally focused programs have had tremendous impact – Country Cares is fast approaching \$1 billion raised – it is year-round local connection that these PDs say lift a station from





good to great. Michel recounts an example: "We recently took the opportunity to break form and held an hour-long program surrounding mental health awareness and suicide prevention. The stories from those affected by the loss of a loved one, input from mental health professionals and stories from survivors were moving, and I received phone calls and emails from our listeners explaining how important and impactful that programming was for them.

One listener called in to explain that she had recently lost a family member to suicide, and as she sat in her car listening to our special programming, she sobbed and felt like someone understood and was there for her."

In the "you can't fake heart" category, having on-air staff to champion causes they believe in strengthens community connection and makes the on-air presentation even more powerful. "Our listeners are family, and we understand that we owe them our existence as a Country radio station," Moon says. "We seek every opportunity to be extra huggable. Successful campaigns aren't just about how much money you raised or how much press you get; success is how many people you emotionally touched where, at the very least, awareness was created." This includes Moon's efforts to raise funds and awareness for the local Shriner's Hospitals for Children with his 80-plus mile Travis Moon Walk event.

"Radio is powerful and can change the community, serve as a unifier and bring heightened awareness, but only if you use it as such," Michel says. "We were thrilled to bring home the win. But, the bigger win is any time we can help someone in our community, which we strive to do daily, with or without direct knowledge of our support. This is a 365-day-per-year team effort, and we could not be more proud of how we do radio at Bonneville/Denver."
