Who's Got The Biggest Cume Of All?

Country programmers and sales staffs have been absolutely giddy in recent years as they've watched cumes for most Country radio stations double once Arbitron's PPM becomes currency in a market and replaces the diary. (We'll fight over TSL's plunge from diary to PPM another time.) Prior to PPM's arrival, no Country outlet had ever cracked the one million listener barrier. Only a handful of stations exceeded 500,000 cumers. Now this format boasts four or five stations at one million plus on a regular basis, with another handful posting audience levels in excess of 900,000. The exuberance is, of course, tempered by the fact that all of the other format cumes have ballooned as well.

Proving that size does indeed matter, the top 23 cuming stations in America are in either New York or Los Angeles. The top five cuming stations are:

- 1. WLTW/New York, AC, 5,859,400
- 2. WKTU/New York, Rhythmic AC, 4,900,200
- 3. WHTZ/New York, Top 40, 4.740,800
- 4. WCBS/New York, Classic Hits, 4,134,400
- 5. KIIS/Los Angeles, Top 40, 4,040,100

To provide some perspective on Country's lot in the PPM cume world, ARB's April PPM shows that Country has only four stations among the nation's Top 100 cuming outlets. KPLX/ Dallas is the Country cume leader with 1,239,800 listeners and ranks No. 70 among all radio stations in PPM markets.

Swift Closes Fearless Tour

Taylor Swift wrapped her international *Fearless Tour* Saturday night (6/5) at Gillette Stadium in Foxboro, MA, and WKLB/Boston MD Ginny Rogers was in the sellout crowd of nearly 57,000. She has a unique perspective on the 15-month, 110-date tour. "I saw the first show in Evansville, IN," she says. "So I saw the very first show and the very last.

"The Evansville venue, of course, was really small, and Gillette is huge. Seeing it at the stadium, everything was super-sized. And it's not just the stage – she added a couple extra songs, too. In fact, she made

a point of telling the crowd that she'd never played 'Jump Then Fall' on the tour, saving it for the right moment and that this was the perfect night."

When discussing sellout country shows in Foxboro, the mind reflexively turns to Kenny Chesney. "Both have a way of connecting with a stadium audience like no other artists I've seen," Rogers says. "Taylor really took the time to let the crowd cheer and scream when they wanted. Out in the crowd she took her time shaking as many hands as possible. Little things like stopping to shake a little girl's hand and taking a bracelet from her wrist to give to the kid were really sweet to see. I've never seen Gillette light up like that. It was very different from a Chesney show."

In fact, Rogers says she's never quite seen an environment like Saturday's. "For as many times been in that stadium, it was strange to have a very calm, well-behaved crowd," she admits. "It was all ages, though certainly dominated by teenagers and young girls. There wasn't as much drinking as you normally see and the vendors were walking around with cotton candy, peanuts and popcorn instead of beer. It just struck me that this is a really cool family event; definitely different with all the glow sticks waving around."

Backstage, Rogers says Taylor was typically thoughtful. "The vibe room had to be one of the biggest meet-and-greets of the tour. She stood up on one of the chairs to thank radio and everyone who helped along the way, but she was a little unsteady so she asked my nine-year-old niece to hold her hand and help her balance. That was a nice moment."

Swift, who wore a No. 13 Patriots jersey as the show drew to a close, wasn't quite ready to say goodbye to her road family. "After the show, usually they all fly out and go to next place," Rogers says. "But they were all so sad they decided to take the tour buses and drive all the way back to Nashville to have an extra day together."

BamaJam Draws Crowd, If Not Radio

WUBL/Atlanta APD/MD **Lance Houston** discusses his most important songs, artists or concerts:

1. Tim McGraw/Live Like You Were Dying: My partner Brad and I heard this for the first time on (then AM) KHCM when we were visiting Honolulu. A pretty cool memory.

2. Alabama/My Home's in Alabama: I can still remember driving up to June Jam every year from Tuscaloosa and dealing with the traffic, heat and crazy people. The highlight

of it all was seeing those guys sing this song.

- **3. George Strait/The Fireman:** I met a new friend during freshman English in college. He was my first real friend that I hadn't known also in high school, and this was his absolute favorite song. He would often call when I was doing weekend overnights to request it, and I would play it for him. Times sure were a lot simpler back then!
- **4. Alison Krauss/When You Say Nothing At All:** This is the first country song I listened to in its entirety. My parents hated country music, so I was never exposed to it. Someone played me this song and I remember thinking, "If that's country music, I could get into that!"
- **5. Shania Twain/Any Man Of Mine:** This was the very first country cassette single that I ever bought. I remember it just being on a continuous loop in my car for about a month.
- A highly regarded song or album you've never heard: I've never listened to a full album that wasn't country.
- An album you played or listened to incessantly: Shania Twain's Come On Over. I think they went with eight or nine singles on that one, but they probably could have released every one.
- One obscure or non-country song everyone should listen to right now: Van Zant's "That Scares Me." Radio missed the boat on that one. Big time.

one thing that surprised me was there weren't a lot of radio stations there covering it," he says. "You had Kenny Chesney, Zac Brown Band, Hank, Jr., Dierks Bentley, Jamey Johnson and Miranda Lambert, among others, but there were only a couple of Dothan, AL stations and us. I would have thought more

people would be there trying to get interviews and interact with the artists. The labels were certainly very accommodating."

Hanrahan is hardly complaining, however, as he says the festival has benefited from it's association with consultant and live music veteran Tony Conway. "This was an almost flawless event backstage," Hanrahan says. "BamaJam is only in its third year, and they've made considerable improvement from last year as far as coordination. It's one of the best run festivals I've seen in a long time. I hope the show will continue to grow, but I'm not sure how much bigger they can really get with the lineup."

Being one of the few stations on hand did have its benefits. "I found out that Zac Brown is expecting his fourth daughter, which will give him four kids under four years of age," he says. As for performances that jumped out at him, Hanrahan singles out two: "Chris Young did a stellar version of 'Rainy Night In Georgia.' And Danny Gokey covered both a Travis Tritt song and 'Life Is A Highway.' He's definitely an entertainer." And overall? "From an entertainment standpoint it lived up to everything they promoted it to be."

Jimmy Wayne Update: Missing Out

As thousands of country fans take over Nashville for the 2010 CMA Music Festival, **Jimmy Wayne** will be braving New Mexico's triple-digit temperatures on his Meet Me Halfway walk to Phoenix for homeless teens. Wayne tells us it will be the first CMA Fest he'll miss since his move to Nashville. "You always

think when you come to Nashville that you're going to run into an artist," Wayne said Friday (6/4). "I happened to come to Nashville during a Fan Fair week and didn't even know it. I thought, 'Wow, it's true! They're playing all over the place!' I told everybody back home, 'You're not going to believe it! They're everywhere out here ... you got to come out here and see this!' Of course the next week they were all gone."



Yep, 70th. **WUSN/Chicago** is No. 2 Country with a cume of 1,195,600, which is good for No. 76. **KKGO/Los Angeles** was third in Country for April (KPLX, WUSN and KKGO jockey around in the top three almost every month) with 1,097,400 cumers, and ranks 95th. Rounding out the Top 100, in 99th place, is **KKBQ/Houston** with 1,053,800 listeners.

For comparison purposes, a pre-PPM Arbitron sweep showed KPLX with a cume of 504,700; WUSN, 688,900; KKGO, 520,700; and KKBQ, 457,700.

A few more PPM cume stats:


- Country places four stations in the 101-200 top cumers and six stations between the 201 to 300 markers, for a grand total of 14 stations among the top 300.
- There are 1,683 radio stations that post a cume audience in PPM; 1,014 have cumes exceeding 100,000 listeners. Of those 1,014, 68 are Country
- A quick overview of the formats in the top 100 cumers shows 19 AC, 13 Top 40, 12 spoken word (News, Sports, Talk, etc.), eight Rhythmic Top 40 and six Hot AC outlets.
 - The national rankings among all cumes outside of the

top 100, with April 2010 PPM cume totals in parentheses:

Finally, please take this piece in the spirit it was written. And don't get me wrong – I'm not complaining. It's wonderful that Country is finally getting the credit for the huge Phantom Cume we have always claimed the diary missed. I just thought it was interesting to see where we stand when compared to other formats. It's perhaps also a reminder that even with the expanded cumes Country is seeing with PPM, it's still about getting folks to listen longer and creating programming that gets them back to the station as often as possible.






