



# Spokane's Quiet Leader

KXLY (Big 99.9 Coyote Country)/Spokane PD Jay Daniels calls the Spokane Country battle "a real dogfight," and with four Country stations in a metro of just over 500,000 (12+), it's easy

to see why. Nevertheless, the just-released Spring book shows the Spokane Television-owned format leader gaining 3.6-4.8, making it one of the most unheralded success stories in one of the most

> contested Country markets in America. What Daniels describes as a combination of good old-fashioned programming



fundamentals and a bit of the unconventional just cooked up a third straight winning book. Close behind the Coyote is Clear Channel's KIXZ (3.1-4.7). Mapleton's KDRK (3.3-3.0) is perennially a contender, too. In fact, in the three books prior to KXLY's current streak, each of the stations had their turn as the top-ranked Country outlet. Add in Blue Sky's nearby KICR/Coeur D'Alene, ID, which is not as competitive but still part of the equation.

KXLY isn't a reporting station and therefore operates below the national radar in many ways. And it's still relatively new, having launched on Christmas 2008 as KEZE 96.9. It had no live jocks until Daniels arrived from KDRK to become PD and morning personality in May '09, bringing his longtime co-host **Kevin James** along. The pair had been with 'DRK for 11 years.

In just its second book as a Country station (Spring '09), KEZE jumped 1.9-4.1, tying KIXZ. The station has been competitive ever since, and things only improved after a call-letter and frequency swap with Triple A KXLY in January '10, which gave the station a greater reach along with its current name and address. 

Promotion for BMLG artists and growing the label's consumer contact pool were top motivations. "When you look at the average attendance on-site, it's 125,000 to 135,000 in this environment, which is bigger than any concert. With the on-site activations, the ESPN element, having Rascal Flatts and Reba perform for the broadcast – plus the opportunity to brand it with bigmachinerecords.com – it had a lot of appeal."

Borchetta's "festival within a festival" plan to bring in much of the roster first involved clearing the date. "With the exception of Reba and [newcomer] Thomas Rhett, everyone had a date the night before. The Band Perry routed, but there were a lot of private planes in the sky Saturday night and Sunday morning. We had to mobilize Rascal Flatts' entire team from Raleigh. Fortunately, Justin Moore is on the road with them so we just sent an aircraft big enough to bring everybody in."

Finalized just six weeks ago, the presenting sponsorship required immediate attention. "Lets see if we can pull this off with the same execution we have for CRS or CMA Music Festival," Borchetta told his staff. "And they over-delivered. It was a flawless couple of days and Sunday was clockwork."

The label's free download promotion and artist info was printed on 50,000 handheld fans. Three weeks of downloads and the website branding have elevated site traffic and enabled the label to increase its database.

Borchetta's personal highlights include a spin around the track with Indy 500 winner (in a Big Machine-sponsored car) Dan Wheldon in the Flatts' "Red Camaro"-inspired custom car, getting to wave the green flag and presenting the trophy with wife Sandi, Reba and Justin Moore to winner Paul Menard.

On the lighter side, Borchetta saw a bit of a transformation in his longtime friend Reba, whose son Shelby recently enrolled in racing school. "She was never really that interested in racing through the years," Borchetta says. "But we were talking to someone in the suite and she stopped and pointed at the TV and said, 'Look! There's a caution!.' I was like, 'Who are you?' She was so into it. An absolute fan."

BMLG also shot the event for a future documentary. "It was a hugely proud day for our artists and for the label group," Borchetta says.



# My Tunes: Music That Shaped My Life



**KTTS/Springfield, MO** PD **Mark Grantin** discusses his most influential songs, albums and concerts:

1. Garth Brooks/The Dance: I had never worked Country before and joined WWQM/ Madison to work for Tom Oakes. Shortly after joining, Tom told me that he thought that within six months I would love the format. He was wrong. It took about six weeks before I heard that song and was hooked.

2. Bruce Springsteen, Alpine Valley, WI,

**Born In The USA Tour, 1984:** The man played more than three hours with no break. One of my top three concerts ever!

- **3. Keith Urban, Rupp Arena, Lexington, 2008:** It was the last night of the tour, they were filming for the DVD and Nicole was there. To top it off, Keith invited a 16-year-old-girl named Leslie from Hazard, KY onstage. She played an incredible guitar solo during "Raise The Barn" and blew Keith away (watch <a href="here">here</a>). It was totally unscripted and magical. Look for it on YouTube. It is one of the best concert moments ever!
- **4. Maynard Ferguson, Milwaukee's Summerfest, 1980:** Legendary. It blew me away.
- **5. The Police/Every Breath You Take:** It's the first song I played on commercial radio.
- A highly regarded song or album you've never heard: Bob Dylan's *Blonde On Blonde*. I've never heard the complete album.
- An "important" piece of music you just don't get: The Doors. If I was programming that format, I'd play them. But I never got into them.
- An album you played or listened to incessantly: Rolling Stones' Hot Rocks. I listened to it over and over as a kid.
- One obscure or non-country song everyone should listen to right now: "Give Me Everything" by Pitbull f/Ne-Yo. I was editing Selector with *Dancing With The Stars* on in the background when I heard it for the first time. I stopped what I was doing and watched. Now I can't get it out of my head.

KXLY's most recent win, however, came without the tools usually associated with a big book. "We didn't have any boards up and gave away no money," Daniels says. "We did not run a TV campaign." While the Coyote's sister TV station has furnished some *CMA Awards* cross-promotion, it's not a consistent source of support. "We haven't done those kinds of things on a regular basis because there are seven radio stations vying for the same promotional time."

So how does Daniels explain a 1.2 share 12+ jump? "People are figuring out where the morning show is," he tells **Country Aircheck**. "We're starting to be more top-of-mind because we've been around longer now. I also think our product is very

sound, so when people come into the store, they stick around."

When it comes to music, Daniels programs the station more by feel than by anything else. He has no perceptual or callout research and regards the methodology he and MD **Tim Cotter** use as "old school." He says, "We'll lock ourselves in the room and listen to everything. If it's something we think works for what we represent and who we are, even if it's by someone we've never heard of before, we'll play it." Two examples of Daniels' philosophy are Brantley Gilbert's "Country Must Be Countrywide" in heavy and Glen Templeton's "I Could be The One" in medium.

Like so many other PDs right now, Daniels believes there's a strong crop of new artists in the format ready to graduate to toptier status. "Blake Shelton and Jason Aldean are two examples.

The only downside with so many of the others is the 'Who's that?' factor," he says. "But if you looked at the top point gainers, that's our playlist."

Mediabase shows KXLY as the most aggressive of the Spokane stations, running just over 80% current/recurrent to gold, with heavies spinning in the low to mid 40s. KDRK has a 70/30 mix, but plays heavy currents upward of 60 times per week. KIXZ

is conservative by comparison -60% current/recurrent with powers in the mid 40s.

Although the Coyote hasn't been around long, it still has a veteran airstaff. Before their decade-plus run at KDRK, Daniels and James did the same morning shift at KIXZ. Market vet Cotter handles afternoons in addition to his MD/APD role. *The Big Time with Whitney Allen* runs at night. Overnights are jockless.

Surprisingly, KXLY runs a jockless midday show with produced imaging, music sweeps and very little contesting. The design is to give the station strong music momentum from 10am-2pm. That's a pretty dramatic palate cleanser from the morning presentation, when Jay & Kevin play a maximum of three songs per hour, far less than KIXZ or KDRK; both play 10 or more.



With nearly 17 years of market equity between them, the morning team has apparently transcended music. Daniels explains their approach: "We don't target country [P1s] per se, but more a lifestyle." The room also has the entire 25-54 cell covered. "I turned 50 this year and have three kids. Kevin is 40 with two kids, and our producer turns 30 this year. He's a great sounding board for us." In addition to performing strongly with Country's core demo, the show does well 18-34, impressive in a college town.

Daniels' longevity in the market and his experience with the Country life group have proved advantageous. Since arriving in Spokane in 1994, he's done mornings at all three Country outlets, twice at KDRK. He's also been PD at all three, which pretty much fulfills the programming commandment, "Know thy audience and know thy market."

If anything, KXLY is a radio *Jurrassic Park* and *Brave New World* at once: Big morning show. Programming by gut. And music, music, music. "To their credit, the company has been gracious enough to let that happen, because that's a leap of faith," Daniels says. "You're in a market a long time and live the lifestyle the way you think your listeners are living it. Hopefully, you have something in common."
