MCA's Harris & Moberly Go There

Music Corporation of America President/CEO Mike Harris and SVP/Promotion Damon Moberly aren't shy about the rebranding confusion and painful staff cuts from which the label group formerly known



as UMG/Nashville has recently emerged. While answering the hard questions, they also share their vision of a creative hub served by a culture of winning across all platforms - including two staffs of radio promotion "all-stars."

CA: You're coming off a multi-week No. 1 run with Josh Ross, Sam Hunt and Tyler Hubbard. How does it feel to be stacking up some wins? **DM:** Pretty good. Given what we've been through, we were thrilled to deliver all three.



MH: When we did the reorganization, even though it was painful, we felt that we had two all-star teams. And if you look at them top to bottom, even the young kids are stars. We know it's not easy [to have airplay success] but I'm not surprised because of the team we have – starting at the top with Damon, then Miranda McDonald and Jimmy Rector. I hate to say it, but I'm

from New York and we put the Yankees together.

DM: We all play pretty nice [in country music] with our plans and syndication, but the dedication of this group goes way back. The length of time they've been in the game and the relationships that go with that - the focus has been pinpoint accurate. Culture is important, too, as Mike talked about when we made these changes. We're going to win. If we get the planes in sight of the airport, we're going to land them.

What was your message to the full staff, Mike, once the changes were made? What's the vision you laid out?

MH: When I left for a heartbeat then came back, there was a lot of (continued on page 13)

O2 CDM Drivetime Leaders

Following the <u>analysis</u> of the format's Q2 drive-time leaders in PPM markets last month, Country Aircheck has also compiled Country's top performers for the quarter from Nielsen Audio's 44 Continuous Diary Measurement (CDM) markets.

WIVK/Knoxville retains the lead in morning drive for the sixth consecutive quarter, with Joey Tack and Nancy Barger edging up from an 11.4 to an 11.6. A 4.2 share jump for the **Spencer Graves** Show gives WDRM/Huntsville the runner up spot, just 0.2 behind WIVK. WHKO/

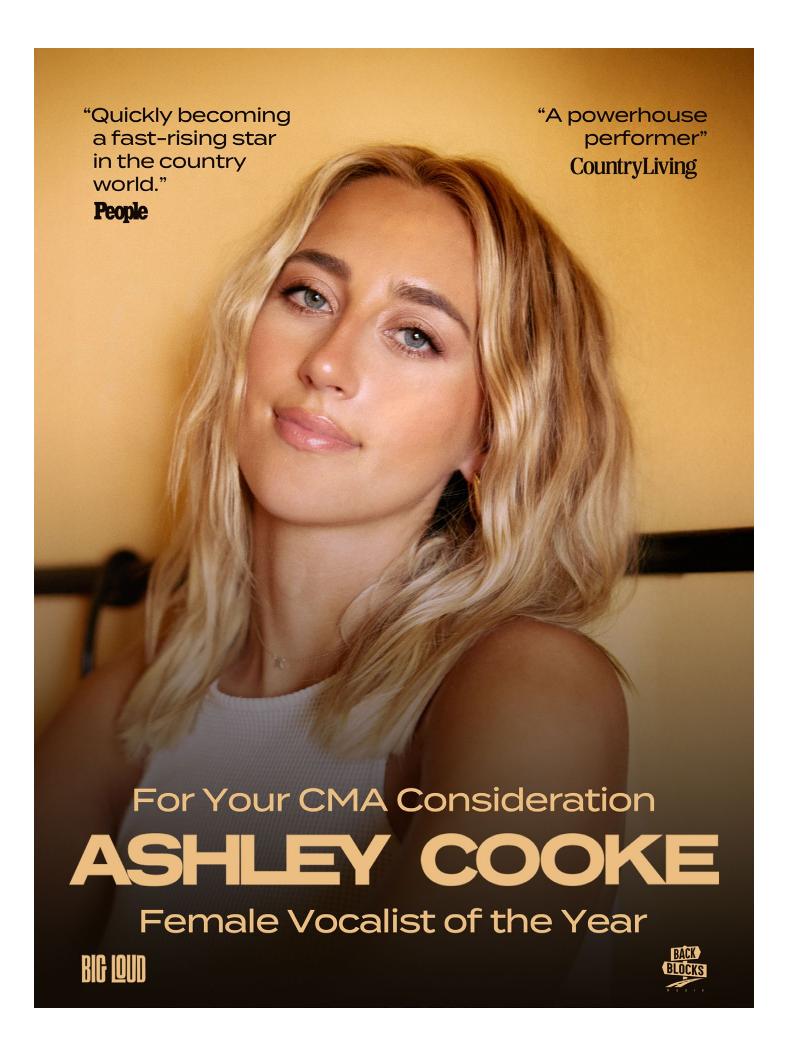


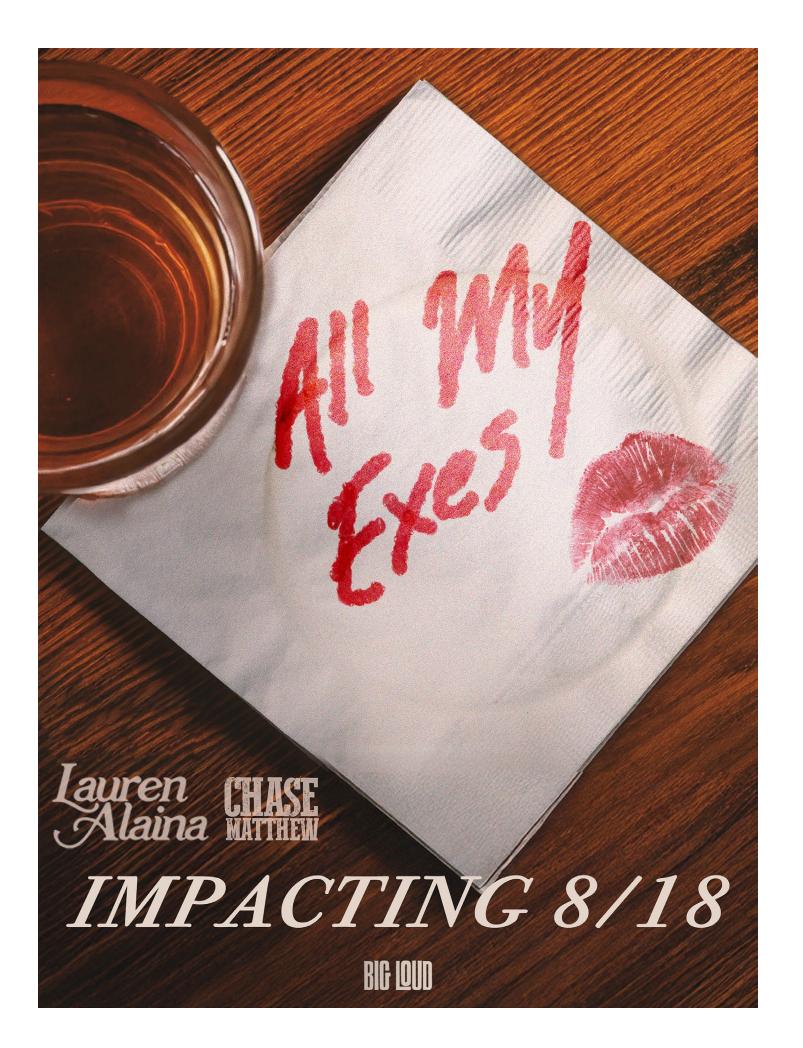

Dayton's **Nancy Wilson** and **Woody** are the only other morning show in double digits, ranking third thanks to an 8.6 to 10.7 increase.

As in mornings, WDRM saw a huge jump in afternoons, with Wayne D & Tay going from an eighth place 8.4 last quarter to a daypart-leading 11.3 share. This is the first time WDRM has led afternoons since Q1/2023. Two stations tied in second with a 10.9 share each. **Erik "EJ" Johnson** on **KXKT/Omaha** grew 2.2 shares from sixth place last quarter, while WHKO's **Jake Ryan** slipped from a share of first place last quarter, despite adding half a share to his tally. Previous results here: Q1; Q4 2024; and Q3. —Chris Huff

Dolly Musical Opens

An industry-packed crowd gathered at Nashville's The Fisher Center for the Performing Arts Aug. 8 for the premiere of the *Dolly: A True Original Music*, based on the life of Dolly Parton. Slated for a 2026 Broadway run, the show began previews in Nashville July 18 (<u>CAT 3/5</u>).

Parton wrote all the music and co-wrote the book for the musical, which traces her life from her early childhood through about mid-career and film stardom in titles including 9 To 5, The Best Little Whorehouse In Texas and

Steel Magnolias. Her early days in Nashville play a central role, including being discovered and meeting her husband, Carl Dean, with viewers learning more about their famously private marriage in the show's two hour and 45-minute run time than most fans did during their nearly 60-year union.

Her lifelong feminism was a theme throughout, with Parton's emancipation from Porter Wagoner (played by John Zdrojeski) a central plot



point. A 30-person cast includes three actors who play Parton at different ages, although lead "Dolly," Katie Rose Clarke, stays onstage much of the time, observing the other Dollys in flashback. One segment, featuring a hostile cadre of paparazzi, gives Parton an opportunity to showcase some of her best quips and one-liners, while also demonstrating the dark toll the spotlight took on her.

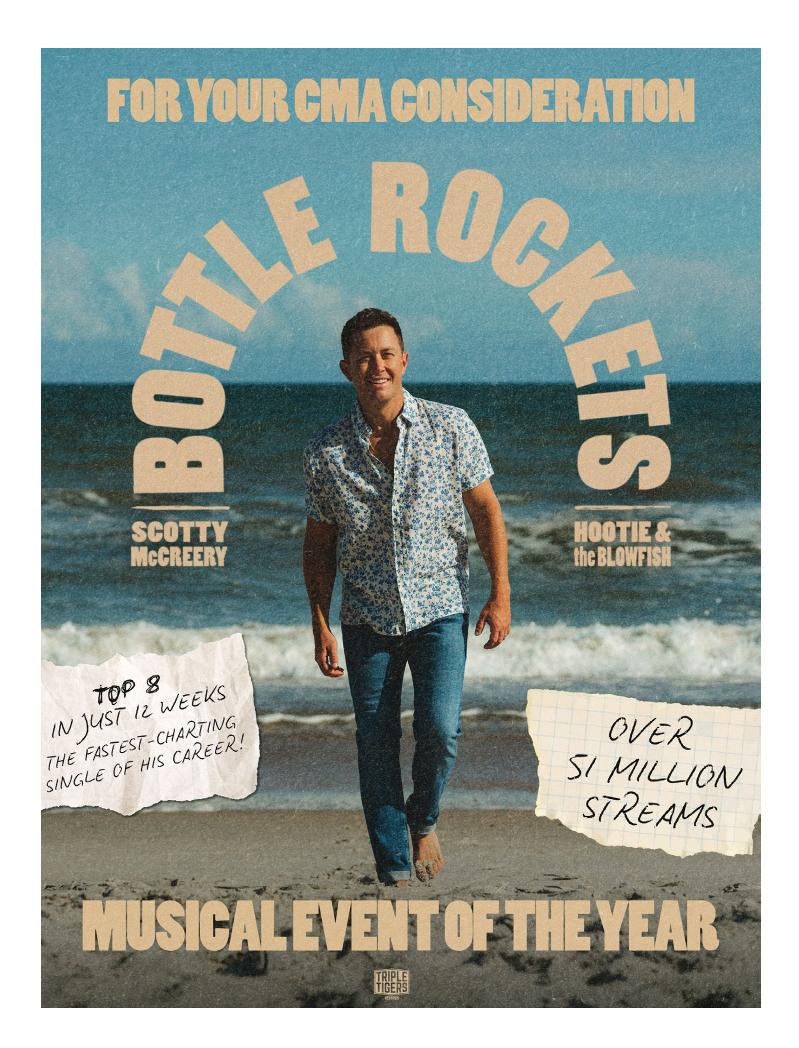
The musical numbers are a combination of new material, and some of Parton's best-known hits, including "Jolene," "Coat Of Many Colors," "Here You Come Again," "Nine To 5" and "I Will Always Love You." WIVK/Knoxville and WSM-AM/Nashville both feature as settings within the show.















Attendees at the premiere got a glimpse of the real Parton, who came out for a wave during the curtain call, then led a champagne toast in the lobby from high on a balcony, Evita style, as she joked.

Parton's agency Results Global is buying time on Nashville stations WSIX, WSM-AM and a handful of others to promote it locally. — Phyllis Stark

Chart Chat

Congratulations to **Nate Smith**, **Dennis Reese**, **Mallory Michaels** and the **Sony** promotion team on taking "Fix What You Didn't Break" to No. 1. This is Smith's fourth release and fourth No. 1, making him the 15th artist in history to launch a career with four consecutive No. 1s. Songwriters are **Ashley Gorley**, **Taylor Phillips**, **Lindsay Rimes** and Smith.



And kudos to **Reese** and crew on landing 22 adds for "6 Months Later" by **Megan Moroney** to top the CA/MB Add Board. This is the first time one label has led the Add Board for three weeks with three different releases since Capitol did the trick October-November of 2019.

self-reflection. What would I have done differently? One of the things we needed was to switch the culture to exactly what Damon said: Get used to winning. Have that mentality. Find a way to make it work instead of waiting for something to go wrong. That's got to be the mindset of the whole company from the top down.

We were in a meeting at one point and there was some griping about the setup of a project. I said, "Everybody stop. We can sit here bitching and moaning – and predetermine the fate of this release – or we can do the work we're fucking paid to do and make it happen." I saw the lightbulb go on for some folks in that moment. "Oh, okay. I get it." Since then, there have been some situations where we're in a room and there's an energy around getting it done instead of going, "Well, we're cooked."

Get accustomed to winning. It sounds simple, but it's something you can practice. We even joke that we have to repeatedly say things like, "Parker McCollum, best album of his career." If you want it to happen, get it out there into the ether.

DM: That change has been palpable in this stretch of number ones. These are good records and researched really well, but they'd all been around for a while. Nothing was a given, but we weren't going to take no for an answer.

You beat me to the question about the mood in the building. So what's the feedback from artists and managers – particularly with the imprint changes and downsizing?

MH: Obviously, there was a lot of confusion. Nobody really likes change, and we changed staff and our name, too. How much crazier can you get? People push back, but over time as you explain the strategy, they become more accustomed. We didn't do this for shits and giggles. We're focused on building brands, and we want our labels to have identities to them. Late the first night after the name change, I got a text from someone saying, "Nobody likes your name." I replied, "They'll get used to it." On the other hand, John Osborne sent me a text immediately saying, "That's fucking awesome. I love it."

DM: There's an old Willie Nelson quote about the trials of the record business to the effect of, "When things are tough, it's nothing a hit record can't fix." We made some big changes, but we also built these two superstar teams and since then have reeled off a bunch of wins. Tucker Wetmore went No. 1 with his debut single. Jordan Davis had a No. 1 record. Now we've got three in a row. Every time we deliver, that will go a

long way with managers.

We're not kidding ourselves. There's still a long way to go. We're not popping champagne ... although we did this morning, actually, since it's never too early for champagne. (laughs) But we're going to celebrate the wins

and learn from our losses. Also, if we get this right, it's a big win, not just for us, but for the whole town. I got congratulatory texts from people at Sony and Warner. We're very conscious of what this company means to country music. We're striving to live up to that.

You've recently made <u>A&R</u> and <u>Digital</u> hires. How are the other departments gelling so far?

MH: When we made these cuts, we went a little deeper knowing we'd be building back up. The consolidation with the promotion team allowed us to invest in A&R and digital. That was the plan. You'll see more hires over the next couple of weeks. We're also doing things a little differently in that I'm not the guy running the company by myself. We have a senior executive meeting every week to talk about high level strategy so that everyone buys in. That's enabled us to come together pretty quickly relative to where we'd been if it had been me telling everyone what to do.

DM: It's made a big difference. The culture here has always been strong, but allowing folks to have a voice in that meeting has raised the excitement level and awareness about where we're headed and how we're getting there.

What does that shift of resources say about the state of radio today and its place in your plans?

MH: We're still the biggest show in town as far as radio promotion. Nobody has more promotion people than us. We still believe in radio as an important piece of the puzzle. I went to St. Louis recently, not just to see Luke Bryan, but knowing there would be radio people there, too. Seeing Josh Ross get a No. 1 and knowing what that's going to mean to his career and how it will help us ... it's beyond belief.

This is also about how important the songwriters are to us. [Chief Creative Officer] Dave Cobb told me early on that we'd lost touch with the town. Now, I don't know Ashley Gorley that well, but I went to lunch with him and asked him how often he talks to labels. He said in the last two years only one person from a label has called him, and that was me. We've done the <u>Song Buddy</u> deal with Jessie Jo Dillon, reached out to other writers and recently did a staff thing where we all wrote a song together with coaching from [writers] Joe Fox and Brad Rempel.

DM: If I had to write songs for a living, I'd starve to death. But Mike wants us being more involved with that community, and its fun watching those guys be so excited when we ring the bell on one of their songs.

MH: It's a matter of making sure we're balancing that audience puzzle by having expertise in every area. Seeing Dave work day in and day out is hard to explain, but he's making this place a creative hub. We're giving people the freedom to create stuff here. The goal is to take this company to the next level creatively and in terms of hustle. We aim to be great partners and stay very focused on our priorities.
