The group released holiday album On This Winter's Night (Volume 2) Sept. 26, and will embark on the This Winter's Night Tour in December. A Country radio staple, the trio has amassed 11 No. 1 hits and nine billion+ digital streams, and earned ACM and CMA "Vocal Group of the Year" trophies three years in a row, as well as seven Grammys, while consistently delivering harmony-soaked performances "unlike any other" (New York Post).


