# John Sebastian's Wolf: "A Whole 'Nother Animal"

The original Wolf launched on KPLX/Dallas in July 1998. In its short history, it has become one of the most

honored, storied and imitated of all Country stations. Veteran programmer **John Sebastian** was named PD of the Cumulus Country outlet in mid-March, and in a very short time has transformed the Wolf into a very different animal than architect and original PD **Brian Philips** birthed almost nine years ago.

# Country Aircheck: What were your first impressions of the Wolf as you considered taking the PD post?

**JS:** The music was too safe. It wasn't as aggressive as I thought it had been in the past and should be now, based on its reputation. And, it was incredibly cluttered – too much jock talk, too many promotions and commercials, and on and on. It was hard to listen to for very long with much loyalty.

One of the internal emails you sent me referred to the ratings in "the first full month since the transformation of the Wolf." It sounds like you've done a lot more than tweak.

The reason for a "transformation" rather than a "tweak" was pure and simple, black and white mathematics. The ratings before I got here were the worst back-to-back monthlies in the history of the Wolf. It didn't need a tweak that might get a three share; it needed a transformation to get back to the four's and five's and into a Top 3 position in 25-54 Adults.

The Wolf was beginning to sound too much like KSCS and going off on some tangents that weren't very mass-appeal. The station was misaligned, with a lot of promotions, events and concentrated efforts targeted to 18-34s and not 35-44s. Based on my knowledge of successful Country radio, if you don't win 35-44, you're dead. And the Wolf was getting slaughtered 35-44. Even though the Wolf was beating KSCS 18-34, the [ratings] disparity between the Wolf and KSCS in the core demo were really, really bad. What we needed was a transformation that led us to become a more mature 35-44 Country radio station.

## **Pareigis Heads Nine North**

To hear new **Nine North Records**President **Larry Pareigis** tell it,
there's no better time for him to strike
out under his own banner. "You have
a group of artists who sell a significant



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amount of units but don't sell enough CDs to stay on a major label," he says. "On the other end of the spectrum, there are a lot of high quality baby acts coming along that don't want to wait until 2010 to have their product and career launched. I see this as an opportunity and incentive."

Pareigis' concept, a "virtual" label that brings quality music to Country radio, draws on the 50-plus years of promotion and radio experience brought by himself and regionals **Ryan Barnstead** (Epic, Columbia, Rust), **Tony Benken** (RCA, Virgin, BBR) and **Greg Stevens** (BNA, KNIX/Phoenix, KRST/Albuquerque).

"We'll be aligned with several highly experienced professionals who can bring sales, marketing, public relations, digital and artist development skills to the mix on an a la carte basis," Pareigis says.

Clients including **John Berry**, **Ty Herndon**, **Brent Keith** and **The Roys** will be Nine North's early priorities. "There's a terrific community of independent labels flourishing in Nashville and delivering cutting edge music," Pareigis says. "Proof that indie labels can thrive and compete is evidenced by the airplay their music is receiving, their presence on national music trade charts, and the sales reports that reflect that the product is being purchased by consumers."

# 99.5 THE WOLF A WHOLE NOTHER ANIMAL

## Animal Plan It (continued from page 1)

I went into this ready to make whatever moves were necessary for this to be a dramatic and obvious change. The Wolf is among the best-branded stations of any format in the country; Susquehanna spent a lot of money over the years to market it very effectively. Everyone in town has heard of the Wolf. I needed to give it back its edge. It might not be the exact same edge that it had in its initial years, but I had to give it a distinctive quality so it was truly unique from [cross town Citadel Country competitor] KSCS. I'm confident we've done that. It can be argued whether or not it's going to work, but we definitely don't sound anything like KSCS.

## What are some of the things you've done to make that happen?

We made it much more music intensive, playing significantly more music than KSCS. Whenever I come into a station, I try to make sure we're playing more music than the competition.

We've also given the Wolf a unique music edge in the way that I did at KZLA/Los Angeles, WLXX/Lexington and WSM-FM/Nashville. We've incorporated *all* of the great country music from all the different angles – from Country Rock to traditional country, from the best of Texas Country to Classic Country.

#### Is there a difference in the Country Rock you have on the Wolf from what you've put on the air in other markets?

There aren't massive changes, but there are some based in the idiosyncracies of Dallas-Ft. Worth. For


example, we play ZZ Top here and I never played that in Nashville. We were a little softer in Nashville than we are here. The Wolf's Country Rock is more upbeat, more tempo-driven than what we played in Nashville.

Everything I play in the Country Rock arena has a country lyric, a country melody and comes from the heart in the same way good country songs do. I don't believe the average listener will treat them any differently than they treat regular country songs. It's a much broader spectrum of what country music is and can be. Our image sweepers point that out, saying, "George Strait, Keith Urban, Eagles, Clint Black and Johnny Cash – you'll hear 'em all on 99-5 the Wolf, a whole 'nother animal."

**I see you've adopted that line as your new positioner.** Yes, it's on the air and on billboards and in our TV

spots. The Wolf is definitely a buzz in the community. People enjoy the fact it is a unique radio station. And, that's where the "whole 'nother animal" line comes from. It's perfect for this situation. It alludes to the Wolf and points out that something different has happened. It's also vernacular that is used very much in the South. Of course, if you're going to use that line, you'd better be a very unique radio station. After we were using it I found out it was close to the Texas Tourism Board's slogan "It's Like A Whole Other Country," which is very symbiotic.

Many people thought in its early days the Wolf played much more Texas music than it actually did. Given that as a caveat, what have you done with the Texas music position?

What we're doing now is more like what Brian Philips first envisioned. When he called the Wolf "Texas' Country," it was no different then when I called KZLA "Southern California's Country." There were some things geared to Southern California more than other places. But it was more about imaging than a day-to-day, song-by-song thing.

For years in any given week the Wolf might have only been playing 14-18 songs in the national top 30.

There were a number of major hits it didn't play because the songs weren't "wolfalicious," that is, they didn't fit the sound of the Wolf. Have you made changes to the Wolf's current music philosophy?

We don't think that way anymore. I am open to any great country song that comes along. I'm not going to make the subjective decision of who is or is not a "Wolf artist" for the listener. I can't possibly know that. Only the listeners can make that judgment.

There are a number of major artists and songs that have not been played on the Wolf, and I have put many of them in. Some of them are shockingly unfamiliar to our listeners. I put them in because they're such great songs and it adds depth to the station that was lacking.

#### How has your on-air presentation changed?

We don't talk over the music, which is one of my fortes, and we don't talk all over the ends of songs, either. We put the music on a pedestal; we make it the star. We don't need to destroy part of the artist's craft by talking all over it. In itself, that significantly changes the feel of the station.

The pacing of the presentation is slower and more mature, which is appropriate since we've gone from being geared to 18-34 to 35-44. In the past the Wolf had a Top 40 approach to country, where now we have more of a Rock or Hot AC approach. I'd like to think we're genuinely enthusiastic as opposed to some sort of false hype.

We still occasionally use the phrase "Texas Country" and still use Barry Corbin as a station voice, although we now use Bob Brooks as a secondary voice. The combination makes a nice mix so people don't get burned out on either style.

#### What have you done with mornings?

We've gone from playing six-eight songs an hour to 9-10 songs. There's definitely less talk than there was before. We've isolated the strengths of everyone on the show and are concentrating on bringing out the best in each of them. We're also taking away some of the things that caused clutter. Since you joined the Wolf, two very prominent and long-time Wolf personalities, Cody Alan (mornings) and Amy B. (afternoons), have resigned. Will the Wolf be more hurt by their departures than helped by "streamlining" the station with personalities new to those dayparts?

Both Amy and Cody were honest about what was in their hearts about the new direction. I honor and admire their decision to resign if what we're doing doesn't fit their vision of what they want to do on the radio. In my experience it's always better for all concerned and for the radio station in particular to have a staff full of people that believe in the product we're putting out there.

The sound of the radio station needed to change significantly. All one had to do is look at the ratings to realize that. Certainly there will always be listeners who want their favorite radio station to stay the way it's always been, no matter how the ratings look. But there will be far more listeners who will now enjoy our new broad, mass appeal approach to Country.

A number of Wolf loyalists are making it known they are unhappy with the changes. It's tough for the staff to hear, but if we didn't get calls like that, it would mean we didn't make big enough changes. When you have bad ratings, you have to upset the relatively small number of fierce loyalists to go from a two to a four or five share. You can't placate them and expect to make a major improvement in the ratings.
