



## 40 Years Of KZSN Stories

Re-branded as "102.1 The Bull" in 2013 concurrent with the launch of *The Bobby Bones Show* in mornings (CAT 2/8/13), iHeart Media's **KZSN/Wichita** originally launched as "Kissin' 102" on Valentine's Day 1986.

Because of course it did. Owned by Southern Skies at the time, the former Top 40 KSKU was a move-in to the market from Hutchinson, KS, more than 50 miles away. Opening in the new format with the band Atlanta's "Sweet Country Music," KZSN's love affair with country and Wichita has been going strong ever since.

That first iteration took "a contemporary, music-intensive approach to the format to counter the stylized sound that [crosstown rival] KFDI employed," says **Pat Moyer**, the station's unofficial historian, who was named MD in 1991 and PD in 1993. The approach paid off: Moyer says the station debuted with a 7.3 share (adults 12+), and it went on to top KFDI 25-54 in just its second book on the air (Fall '86). Below, KZSN veterans share favorite memories:

**Rick Edwards** (1986-2000; PD 1986-1993; mornings 2002-2003): Rusty Walker and Phil Hunt were our consultants, and we had a tough row to hoe going up against a dominant station in KFDI, but we debuted third overall by coming out of the chute blaring a "more music" position and a four song in a row guarantee. KFDI had an hourly newscast and everybody went there for the weather, so we just hammered the music. In those early days, we also gave away a couple of cars and – via a deal with a local builder – a house we called the "Kissin' Castle."

**Pat Moyer**: The station was housed in [a pre-fab] metal Butler building in the middle of a field with AM towers, and was sad looking inside, so we always told people radio was meant to be heard and not seen. When I'd direct people to the radio station, I'd always tell them, "Turn in when you see what looks like the place the county would store its weed-eaters." It wasn't much to look at, but those were my best years in radio because of the people.

KFDI was heavily farm and ranch-oriented, but the aircraft industry and banks were a large part of Wichita, and we wanted to present country music as not just for people with agricultural backgrounds. When Garth

**AA:** Big Loud is a wonderful place. I was very happy there and not looking for a job. When this came my way, I was close and comfortable enough with the partners to have an open conversation with them. Seth [England] and I talked a lot about what this would mean for me personally, and about the decision making process.

Meeting [Warner Chappell Co-Chairs] Guy Moot and Carianne Marshall, learning more about Warner Chappell and meeting the people, it became more of a potential reality. I was torn, but ultimately, this allowed me to get a little closer to the creative side again. Working closely with songwriters and artists has been one of my favorite parts of every job I've had.

**You're known mostly as an attorney. Why publishing?**

I came to Nashville as a musician, played in cover bands and wrote songs. One of my first jobs was working for one of the best songwriters we have, Jon Randall, as tour manager and day-to-day when he was on Sony. I learned so much from him and his wife Jessie Alexander about songwriting, the artist world and record labels. Eventually, I decided to reignite the legal aspect of my background. In my entertainment law practice, artists, writers and publishers were the highlights. Getting to work with a brand new writer or artist and help them find or grow their team – I cherished that.

**Ben's passing hit so hard. How did that affect your decision?**

First and foremost, he was a friend who I admired and loved working with. Processing the personal feelings around that comes first. Then it's looking at the company and this wonderful team in Nashville. What are they going to think? Am I going to be able to give them what they need? Then you think about the larger community.

What I realized was, Ben created an incredible culture and put this company in an amazing position. Having someone focused on growing what he helped build is something he would have wanted. For the 22 years I've been in Nashville, Warner Chappell has been at the center of this community. And that's not just Ben, it's also [former heads] Gary Overton, Tim Wipperman and all of the incredible people in admin and A&R over the years. So it's an honor to be part of an historically important company.

Then it's about getting to it. Continue the tradition of signing great songwriters. Enable our great creative staff – some of the best A&Rs in town – and help them maintain the passion they have for our writers and their music.

**You're five months in. How's it going?**

Really well. At first there was a lot of listening and getting to know the staff. I feel really good about the culture and that everyone here is focused on being the best publisher and how to go about that. My goal is to take a meeting with every writer we have, and it's a lot. I've gotten started, but it's going to take a while. Getting back to those direct relationships has been nice.

What I hadn't experienced before was working within the Warner Chappell system – Guy and Carianne, their team and the board. The record side, too. It's been as good if not better than advertised.

**How was it winning Publisher of the Year at SESAC and BMI?**


An interesting moment for me, as you can imagine. Receiving an award that was 100% based on work I had nothing to do with ... there's a heavy heart for Ben, but also the thought that I didn't need to be up there. But I have to say that the Warner Chappell family, SESAC, BMI, other publishers,

friends and even people I don't know were so supportive in pulling me up and saying, "You're with us. Let's go." So there's a giant sense of pride in celebrating all of them in that moment, but also that I now get to be part of carrying that on. It's about the song. It's about the songwriter. We're all here to change people's lives with music. There's nothing better than that. –Chuck Ayl

Brooks came to town, we were able to project our logo on the outside wall of the Kansas Coliseum from a distance, and it looked like it was painted on. [Great Empire Partner/CEO and 35-year KFDI morning co-host] Mike Oatman didn't like it, went to the county and had them change signage laws so we couldn't do that again.

**Dan Holiday** (MD, 1992-2004): Original station owner Jerry Atchley, who also owned KSSN/Little Rock, came in with a briefcase the first time we billed \$400,000 in a month. He handed everybody four \$100 bills. Atchley also believed in investing heavily in station promotional items, which we sold. Some of the popular merch included bolo ties, and "cow caps," which were

half ball cap and half cowboy hat.

I did a Toy-a-Thon every year at Christmas and would live with artists – including Chely Wright – on a department store roof.

[**Brian Jennings** PD from 2011-2017 adds, "If you look at some of those photos, Dan's smiling and artists like Chris Cagle and Jimmy Wayne are freezing their asses off and have a look like, 'Can I get down now?' They hated him for it."]

**Chuck Geiger** (PD, 2003-2005): When Miranda Lambert came to play in 2005, she didn't have the ability to do load in and out with the full band, so I got the staff from a couple of our stations to help, and even the label's Buffy Cooper and I were carrying instruments and amps. The next year, I was in Fresno and saw Buffy at a George Strait show that Miranda was opening. She said Miranda and her dad, Rick, wanted to see me because she remembered us as roadies.

**Cody Carlson** (PD, 2008): When everything was live and local, we had an impact on the community because we were out there pressing the flesh and being visible. It was a three-way race then among KZSN, KFDI and The Wolf [KVWF]. I bought the internet domain for "The Wolf" and directed it back to KZSN.


As the first woman PD of this heritage station with guys who had been there long-term, I really had to earn their trust and put up with a lot. But after our ratings started going up and some very successful promotions, they were all on board

**Anthony "The AntMan" Allen** (PD, 2009-2011): When I got there, Cathy Carrier was doing mornings – a second-generation broadcaster who is well known in the market. Me coming in as a relatively cocky new PD and morning show guy, I thought I'd continue to let her be part of the show. Looking back, I got to be on the show with her.

Lyman James had the idea to do the morning show from different towns. Once a week for about three months we'd




**No One Else On Earth: Dan Holiday with Wynonna Judd at a 2002 KZSN event.**

broadcast from a restaurant or donut shop. We'd show up at 3am on a Friday and take over the back booths. We were jury-rigged together without a soul back at the console, but nobody would have known. We were always the underdog, and you can get away with more stuff that way.

**Brian Jennings** (1994-1996; PD, 2011-2017): My first run at KZSN, we were in the metal building with field mice running through the station. Dan Holiday and I produced a statewide countdown show and would listen to new CDs as they came in. If we thought they were garbage, we tossed them out the window into the field. The lawn mower guys would run over them, we'd hear the grinding and die laughing: "There goes [insert artist name here]."

The station was very aggressive with new music. Rick Edwards, Bob Walker, Dan Holiday and Pat Moyer were real personalities who developed a tight following. Our staff spent an average of 10 hours a day at the station. There was a lot of pride in it.

**Jim Dorman** (PD, 2017-2020): When I was there, the building was an old distribution center for Pizza Hut with a loading dock. I was taking out the trash one day and had an idea to host concerts on the dock, picturing a hundred chairs inclined up the

ramp. We always booked someone with enough hits that people had heard of them, including Craig Campbell, Runaway June and Uncle Kracker. The audience wouldn't know who it was until the garage door opened and they started playing. The first one we did a police car showed up. I walked over and asked if I could help them, and the officers said they were just there to find out who the artist was.

**Michelle Buckles** (2009-2015; returned in 2018; PD since 2022): Wichita was the first affiliate for Bobby Bones on our sister [Top 40] KZCH. So listeners already loved *The Bobby Bones Show*, making it a natural shift to bring him over to KZSN. Wichita loves him and he also loves Wichita. His comedy shows here always sell out.

KZSN just feels like home, and I think a lot of Wichitans feel that way, too. We've had amazing talent on-air over the last 40 years, and it's made us very reliable, reputable and trustworthy. We did our first St. Jude Radiothon in 2021, and I was nervous Wichita wouldn't embrace it. But we have built so much trust over the years; the donations blew us away. That's a great feeling.

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

# January 2026 PPM Scoreboard


The Nielsen PPM January 2026 Survey (1/8-2/4) saw Cumulus end its subscription to Nielsen across all PPM markets due to ongoing litigation. Despite the loss of eight Cumulus stations, total Country shares were still up from 295.0 to 311.5 - a 5.6% increase. On a same-station basis, that 311.5 represents a 17.5% jump from the Holiday book. Cume was up 2.4% on a same-station basis, from 17.6 million in the Holiday survey to 18.0m. **WUBE/Cincinnati** claimed the largest share in the

format for the first time since last May, thanks to its 3.5 share jump, while **KKBQ/Houston** led in cume. Two regular occupants of the top 10 cume list, Dallas' KPLX and KSCS, are no longer visible. Legend: A "+" indicates a Classic Country outlet; a "^" designates co-owned Country stations in the metro; a "t" indicates a tie; and a "\*" indicates a station that is a recent subscriber for which ratings were not currently available. Ranks are among subscribers.
