Radio's Last Training Ground? (Pt. 1)

Competence in content development, copywriting, social media, audio and video editing, scheduling, ratings methodology, talent management and planning is something station managers look for in potential PDs. At the same time, many point to those qualities as essential for morning show producers.

The job is certainly one of radio's last best training grounds, as Country Aircheck discovered in a series of conversations exploring the position. Despite its importance, the job is often overlooked and misunderstood, and in recent years has even become a target

for elimination as companies look to improve their bottom lines. This two-part series appears with that in mind, the first of which attempts to understand what exactly morning show producers do.

This Monkey Means Business: "A morning show producer is not some monkey behind the board pushing buttons, answering phone calls or getting coffee for the morning show guys," says KSCS/Dallas APD/MD/afternoon personality **AI Farb**. "They're basically the program director for the

morning show." Farb knows as he spent the last few years producing KKBQ/Houston's Q Morning Zoo. The 31-year-old, who left in February for KSCS (CAT 2/16), says KKBQ morning host Tim Tuttle described the role best. "He said the show was like a treehouse," Farb recalls. "The hosts are the keepers of the treehouse and invite all the listeners to come in and be part of it. The producer is underneath holding it up, making sure it stands well and looks nice."

Treehouses are only as sturdy as the tree supporting them, of course, and have a unique and wide-ranging set of maintenance requirements. "Day to day for me meant prepping and gathering content for the show, booking guests, and managing any off-air content," Farb explains. "You're also the liaison inside and outside the building for the morning show. I went to all the promotions and marketing meetings and made sure I was copied on all emails. I handled scheduling for everything, even the morning guys' vacations. There's much more to producing a show than what happens when the show is on the air."

Thursday: Country Music Hall of Famers the Oak Ridge Boys (backed by the New Orleans Marine Corps Band) kicked off night one of the Nissan Stadium shows with the national anthem, followed by a few choruses of the Oaks' classic "Elvira." Nashville star Charles Esten ("Deacon Claybourne") and his fellow co-stars


performed a set before **Kane Brown** took the stage and admitted, "This is crazy. I was so nervous when I got up here. This is the biggest venue I've ever played." Brown's show included hits "Heaven" and "What Ifs," featuring Lauren Alaina.

Carly Pearce sang "Hide The Wine" on a satellite stage before Dan + Shay's chart-topping set that included "19 You + Me," "Nothin' Like You" and "From The Ground Up," during which fans lit up the stadium with their phones. The duo thanked

Country radio for making "How Not To" a No. 1, covered Justin Timberlake's "Can't Stop The Feeling" and closed with "Tequila."

Darius Rucker's "Homegrown Honey," "For The First Time"

and "Alright" prefaced new song "Hands On Me." "Comeback Song" was followed by a re-sing of "For The First Time," "due to the magic of television," said Rucker, who ended his set with crowd favorite "Wagon Wheel."

"I moved to Nashville with my brother [John] a long time ago," said **Brothers Osborne**'s TJ Osborne. "It never dawned on us that one day, we'd be playing for



you guys here at Nissan Stadium tonight." The duo's set started with "It Ain't My Fault," then featured new tunes including "Drank Like Hank," "Weed, Whiskey And Willie" and "Shoot Me Straight."

Headliner **Jason Aldean** closed night one with a steady stream of hits including "Lights Come On" and "Tattoos On This Town." "Hey, I know it's a late night, but I figure it's the first night of these Stadium shows – you guys can't be that tired, right?" he asked. A quick look at a decibel reader app proved in fact, fans were wide awake, screaming and ready to "Take A Little Ride."

Friday: Big Loud's Mason Ramsey performed the national

anthem ahead of a seven-song set from **Charley Pride**. "Is Anybody Going to San Antone?" "Mountain of Love" and "Kiss An Angel Good Morning" made the 84-year-old's setlist before he blew the crowd a kiss and took his leave.

Brett Young opened with "Close Enough" and "Like I Loved You" before playing his favorite cut from his debut album, "Mercy." "You guys sound pretty good," he told the crowd as they joined him on "In Case You Didn't Know." Between sets the Andrew Jackson Elementary School honors choir took the stage for a spot-on rendition of Keala Settle's "This Is Me" from the Greatest Showman soundtrack.

Jake Owen made a brief appearance on the satellite stage to perform "I Was Jack (You Were Diane)" prior to **Luke Combs** taking the main stage for "When It Rains It Pours," "One Number Away," "Hurricane," and a snippet of Brooks & Dunn's "Boot Scootin' Boogie."

A tech-glitch-turned-crowd-pleaser kicked off **Blake Shelton**'s set. He appeared to be performing, but no sound came from the PA. Shelton stepped away and when the audio finally came up, the first thing heard was him saying, "That's bullshit," bringing cheers from the audience. His set list included "I'll Name The Dogs," "I Lived It," and Hal Ketchum's "Small Town Saturday Night."

Old Dominion played "Song For Another Time," "Hotel Key," "Written In The Sand," "No Such Thing As A Broken Heart," "Break Up With Him" and "Snapback" during their well-received



slot. Closer **Carrie Underwood** rang "Church Bells," "Last Name," "Cry Pretty," "Wasted" and more. "It has been so fun bumping into fans this week," she said. "That's what makes this week so fun."

Saturday: Big Loud's **Jillian Jaqueline** sang the "Star Spangled Banner" before **Lee Ann Womack** began the evening's performances with "Does My Ring Burn Your Finger." During the solos in George Jones' "You're Still On My Mind," Womack told the crowd, "That's a fiddle," and, "That's steel guitar." Blistering closer "All The Trouble" drew the biggest response.

For his first time on the "big deal stage," **Jon Pardi** cashed his "Paycheck," "Up All Night" and "She Ain't In It," among others, closing with a medley of "Head Over Boots," "Heartache On The Dance Floor" and "Dirt On My Boots." The evening's sole surprise was **Sam Hunt** popping up in the crowd to sing his new song "Downtown's Dead."

Dustin Lynch and band played "Seein' Red," "Good Girl" and "Mind Reader" before earning a crowd surge covering Drake's "God's Plan." He closed with "Small Town Boy." Kelsea Ballerini talked of attending the event as a fan and urged hopeful performers in the crowd to keep dreaming during a set that included "Unapologetically," "I Miss Me More," "I Hate Love Songs" and closer "Peter Pan."



New mother Morgane Stapleton understandably didn't take the stage with husband **Chris Stapleton**, but the energy was undiminished. "Midnight Train To Memphis," "Hard Livin'" and "Second One To Know" highlighted a set that eschewed talk and stagecraft to rile the crowd through sheer force of musical will.

Closer **Keith Urban** began with "Never Comin' Down" and employed video clips of Julia Michaels and Carrie Underwood for "Coming Home" and "The Fighter," respectively. He closed with "Wasted Time," leaving the audience wishing they had more time with him to "waste."

Sunday: Cloudy skies had given way to late-day sunshine by the time a choir-backed **Ray Stevens** took the stage to deliver the national anthem. **Brett Eldredge, Thomas Rhett, Dierks Bentley, Florida Georgia Line** and **Luke Bryan** performed, with all but the latter delivering six songs. Eldredge, all smiles and boyish excitement, kicked things off with "The Long Way." **Cole**

Swindell appeared next for a one-off, intimate performance of his single "Break Up In The End." Rhett's set followed with hits including "T-Shirt," "Life Changes" and "Die A Happy Man," highlighted by saxophonist Frank Houston, whose talent was featured prominently throughout Rhett's entire set.



The now thick-bearded Bentley opened with "I Hold On" before he and his band launched into **Dwight Yoakam**'s 1994 hit "Fast As You," at which point

Yoakam himself appeared in one of the night's most memorable moments. **Brothers Osborne** joined Bentley soon thereafter on "Burning Man," which was as notable for **John Osborne**'s guitar skills as the collaboration itself.

At the top of the bill, Florida Georgia Line and Bryan kept the audience on their feet and prompted loud, word-for-word sing-alongs. Surprises helped, too, like FGL's live collaborations with the Backstreet Boys ("God, Your Mama, And Me"), Morgan Wallen ("Up Down") and, most notably, Bebe Rexha ("Meant To Be"), whose introduction produced outright screams throughout the venue.

The longest lull of the night, endured by a restless crowd with half-hearted attempts at the wave, prefaced Bryan's closing performance. The superstar took the stage just after midnight with "Country Girl (Shake It For Me)." Bryan recognized Randy Travis in the audience and then sang Travis' "On The Other Hand" and "Diggin' Up Bones." "Maybe we should just make this an hour of Randy Travis," Bryan quipped, noting that neither selection had been rehearsed. "My band is like, 'What the hell are you doing?" After an onstage shot of tequila, the show went into overdrive with "Light It Up," "Play It Again" and "Rain Is A Good Thing." Bryan performed 12 songs in all, including "Rollercoaster," for which Swindell reappeared.

And there were moths. Many, many moths.

Veteran producer **Justin Scheman**, who's served morning shows in a variety of formats and markets and joined WIVK/Knoxville's *Tony & Kris* last month (<u>CAT 5/2</u>), paints a busy picture. "You're literally producing from the time you open your eyes until the time you go to sleep," he says. "It's, 'What can I see, do and say to make the show better?' If you're not thinking like that, you're not a producer."

and start reviewing prep from the night before because a lot of stuff happens after I go to bed at 8:30," he says. "The first thing I do in the morning is see what's trending on social media locally and around the world. When we decide what we need to be talking about, we start looking for a unique angle."

The cancellation of *Roseanne* last month following the star's controversial tweets illustrates his approach. "You're a homerun hitter if you can get Roseanne Barr on the show," Scheman explains while stressing the importance of having a strong network of contacts. "She wasn't talking to anybody, obviously, so can you get Tom Arnold? Can you call somebody at the comedy club where she got her start? And can you do it at four in the morning for air by 7:30? It's tough, but that's the kind of thing that separates good producers from great producers."

A check of the show's prep services follows, but Scheman doesn't lean on them. "Those things are jammed packed with stuff, but everybody in the country has them," he explains. "So if you can find something all your own you have an advantage." Prepping audio, and these days video, is another important task. "You need something that will make the topic stand out," Scheman says. "Sometimes it's current, sometimes not, but it needs to make people visualize what you're saying." The same thing goes for social content, he says. "What can we post that's going to make people interact with us?" he continues. "You can't just post a picture or video, it has to be one that people will like, comment on and want to share."

Scheman farms listener content from social platforms. "Responding on social media is such a huge deal," he says. "And go through their timeline. When you notice a good story say, "Hey, I'd love to have you on the radio tomorrow."

When the show is underway, "It's your job to make the hosts look good and to make sure they're informed," Scheman says, part of which entails proper call screening. "They should be interesting

and upbeat. Some people don't realize the importance of just turning your radio down. I always remind people of the hosts names so that when they go on they're like, 'Hey Tony, hey Kris!' It reinforces the brand. Phone screening is one of the most important things in live radio, especially in the PPM world. You can't let callers waste time."

Ajay Ramos, who replaced Farb at KKBQ,



agrees. "I have about 30 seconds to a minute to make that happen, all while I'm typing up their info for the guys in the studio."

Blurred Lines: "It's a blur, but one I thrive in," says **Chase Hill**, Executive Producer for WKHX/Atlanta's *Cadillac Jack Mornings With Ali Mac.* "Once it's over you're like, 'Holy shit! I can't believe we pulled that off!' But in the moment you just chip away and knock things off the list."

The pace slows after the show, but the responsibilities keep coming. There are upcoming shows to plan for, not to mention promotions and appearances to organize, taped interviews to conduct, follow-ups with potential guests, live reads to facilitate, run sheets and prep materials to distribute, fires to put out, and sometimes "best of" shows and podcasts to bring to life.

Rest doesn't necessarily come when producers make it home, either. Ramos is in regular contact with the show's hosts until he goes to sleep. He's even been known to wake up in the mid-

dle of the night to jot down ideas. "If we come across a good idea, we throw it into our group text just so it's documented," he explains. "From there I put it in the calendar I keep with me. I've even kept an extra notepad next to my bed since I started this job."

Considering the workload and modest salary (\$35,360 on average according to Glassdoor), it makes sense to ask what attracts people to the position. "I wanted to do it because

I had plateaued in my last job," Hill offers. "When I jumped at this people said things like, 'This is a big step for you.' I understood the possibilities, though, so I was like, "Yeah, whatever. Let's go."

"You're really running a mini radio station," Farb surmises, recognizing the skills it can bring to both programming and on-air positions. Now he helps run KSCS, after all. "Almost everything I did transferred over," he says. "That position has been eliminated in a lot of cases, but it's a really important training ground for the next generation."

Return to this space next week as **Country Aircheck** adds PDs and morning show talent to the conversation to explore best practices for hiring producers, assimilation with the morning show and maximizing the position's potential. Reach Farb here, Scheman here, Ramos here and Hill here in the meantime. —Russ Penuell


