

Q&A: KUPL's Dylan Salisbury

Rising to Dir./Content with Connoisseur's acquisition of formerly Alpha KUPL/Portland, OR (<u>Breaking News 9/15</u>), **Dylan Salisbury** is embracing his new employer's live and local mandate.



CA: New company, new OM, new job - kind of a slow year for you?

DS: Something like that, yeah. An insane amount of change over the last six months. As far as the company goes, we're still learning everything together. We're learning what Connoisseur wants to do, and they're learning what they've inherited in terms of what we do. This is a first for them as well. So we're in the process together.

What's a typical week like?

So I was already programming and doing afternoons on the Top 40 station [KBFF] and now I'm also programming KUPL. So it's a lot of schedule planning and making sure I can cover all my responsibilities. We usually start the week off with music meetings and the fresh data that comes down, then I'm on the air at 3pm, scheduling music and doing imaging. All the fun radio stuff.

Does your promotion, B-Dub <u>going live</u> and <u>adding</u> Jamie Tanchyk give the station more opportunity to execute Connoisseur CEO Jeff Warshaw's <u>live and local</u> vision?

It's definitely helpful and something we want to do. That's a big part of this learning process. We have local staff, but what are we going to be able to do in terms of events with this new company? Are they going to want to be NTR heavy? Do they want us to be out and about? I can assume they do.

How does your reporting structure change?

I was the liaison between [Collective Heads'] Tim Richards, Jimmy Steal and the local staff. Now I report to OM Ross McLeod and then up to SVPP Keith Dakin.

What's your radio origin story?

I was going to school just outside of the Twin Cities and won a contest on Top 40 KDWB/Minneapolis to attend a Skyroom Lounge performance. I went to the website to find out where the station was located and saw they were soliciting for interns for the Dave Ryan Show. Coming from a blue collar family, I'd never even thought about radio as a career, but I thought it sounded cool. I needed an internship anyway, so I went for it and got the position. My first day, Kevin James was in the building promoting a movie and I was like, "Well, this is it. I'm in."

Inside CRHoF's 'Rigorous' Process

Each year since 1974, a handful of broadcasters have been inducted into the **Country Radio Hall of Fame**. With the deadline to apply for next year's class approaching, **Country Aircheck** offers some transparency on the selection process.

Nominees must have worked at least 20 years in radio, with a minimum of 15 in Country. Nominations are accepted year-round, but the $\,$

window for the 2026 class closes Oct. 30. The committee overseeing the nominationsto-induction process is co-chaired by

App For That: The initial nomination form can be filled out by the applicant or someone on their behalf. Those nominees (or their family members or surrogates, in the case of posthumous nominations) are next given a questionnaire to provide a more detailed account of their career. Nominees who are not inducted in the year they apply stay in consideration for two additional years, then have the option to update their info and apply again. Between new and returning applicants, the committee considers 100-150 per year across the On-Air and Radio (off-air) categories.

Other than the committee chairs, identities of the participants are kept under wraps to discourage lobbying. The members, who Raab says represent a "diverse panel of people from the Country radio industry," rotate in and out to keep the selection process fresh. Committee participation is by invitation only.

Conclave: Following what Raab calls "spirited discussions," committee members vote in a series of ballots to narrow that year's pool. Curtis says those conversations reveal the extent to which each participant pores over the applications. "I'm always impressed with the homework, the diligence and the rigor they've put into it," he says.

Raab says the committee sees plenty of good and even great careers, but is seeking something "a notch above that." But all nominees get what he terms "a fair hearing" during a "thoughtful and intense process." Curtis jokes that the committee's mantra is, "Just remember, this is the Hall of F#@king Fame."

And what, exactly, does it take to get in the Hall? "People who put their heart and soul into this business, and – in addition to the entertainment factor – did significant work in their communities," says Roberts. "People who left an indelible mark on the industry." Adds Raab, "I'm not personally impressed when an applicant lists all the artists they've interviewed. I want to know what you have done to improve your station, your market and Country radio."

Rootin' Tootin: Rule number one: "Don't campaign to be in the Hall of Fame," says Roberts. Qualified candidates are "self-evident," he says. "A little humility goes a long way." That said, applicants shouldn't be so humble that they leave out key career details. "Don't shortcut it," Roberts says. "If you're telling us about your lifetime of work and you write a four-sentence paragraph, that's probably not going to help your cause."

OFF THE RECORD

Songwriter, producer, musician, painter and flautist **Aaron Raitiere** goes off the record:

Ben Vaughn would say I'm like an onion, because every time we'd hang out, I'd tell him some other crazy-ass story he hadn't heard. I was a public high school swimmer in Kentucky and got recruited by Cornell, which I'd never heard of. My dad is from New York City; he said I had to go. I swam for a year before realizing everyone else was faster, jumped off the team and started a band. Then I moved to Austin chasing a girl and thinking I'd play music.

The first job I applied for was a crossing guard, but I didn't get it because I was overqualified. I was like, "Did I just screw myself completely where I can't even be a crossing guard now?" I wound up parking cars at the IIT parking let then get a job at the Pound Pock CD warshouse. But it to

the UT parking lot, then got a job at the Round Rock CD warehouse. But it was too hot in Texas, so we moved to Gainesville, where I fished catfish for two years while playing music at night.

I got an MFA in recording engineering at MTSU, where I met Anderson East. Dave Cobb

discovered him at the Bluebird and I co-wrote three or four of his first few songs. That got us into Nashville. Then Brent Cobb invited me in on some Whiskey Meyers songs.

My house humand down. I bested a writer's round every Tuesday for six years at Neighbor.

My house burned down. I hosted a writer's round every Tuesday for six years at Neighbors in Sylvan Park, but that night the bar cancelled. Usually I'd just drink 20 beers, but I didn't have any money so I went home and had some Sleepytime tea. Woke up at 2am and the house was on fire.

The next morning I hauled off with Anderson, who was opening Sturgill Simpson's Meta Modern Tour. My clothes were in the house so I bought a suitcase, some jeans and underwear and went on tour selling t-shirts for six months. One night I lost all the money while I was peeing on the side of the road, and owed the band \$200.

This past year I wrote a couple of hit songs and everything picked up steam again. I've been playing guitar in Ella Langley's band and opening for Hayes Carll. [MCA's] Mike Harris and Dave Cobb gave me an A&R Consultant deal, so I'm producing and writing.

I went to my first meeting wearing a suit coat and swim trunks. I felt like a sheep in wolf's clothing. I couldn't decide which team I was on, but pretty sure I'm mostly a songwriter.

When I get off the road with Hayes, I've got it in my calendar to really lay into my painting for a while. I just sold one for five grand. My goal is to sell one for a million.

"You Look Like You Love Me" and "4X4XU" were real pick-me-ups. It's a sort of weird Nashville validation that I didn't really need. I was already fine with Track 17 on every other record. I've got a lot of those. But writing those opened up a whole bunch of doors.

I put a out couple flute albums after listening to a bunch of Native American flute records. My old man insists on getting me something for my birthday, so I told him I wanted a wooden flute and, I'll be damned, he found some guy who makes them. Opening for the Red Clay Strays and at another show for Ella, I walked out in a white graduation robe and played the flute. Everyone started open-mouth breathing. Just looking.

For my birthday show at Chief's I had on a basketball jersey, a soccer jersey, two hockey jerseys and a football jersey. It started down at the *Tortuga Festival*, where they gave me all this free merch before my set and I just put it on because I didn't have anywhere to put it. I started getting hot in the middle of my set and took off a shirt. Some girls up front were like, "Yeah, take it off." I had seven shirts and three pairs of shorts. When I got to the last shirt I said, "Y'all want me to take off my pants?"


The next year is about A&R, painting and exploring other avenues. I've been working on some movie and TV ideas and have a couple unfinished books. I'm the epitome of an ADHD nightmare. I can start boiling water, mow half of the front yard and then take off for California.

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Curtis agrees that applicants are sometimes "the people who put their head down and do the work, not the heat seekers," and their entries can come across as bare bones. "Take stock of your significant contributions, and express them in a way that tells your story," he suggests. "There's a way to toot your own horn without blowing it."

When the inductee class is finally selected, the fun begins. Roberts and Raab say their favorite part of the process is telling someone they're being inducted – an emotional surprise that, in recent years, has been done via Zoom, recorded, and then played back at CRS and the inductions ceremony. Roberts calls it "a beautiful moment."

Many inductees are later invited to join the selection committee and, tellingly, their reactions about the process tend toward surprise. "Once they go through it and see how comprehensive and how pure it is, the feedback I get is that their induction means even more to them with that understanding of how the sausage is made," Curtis says.

Adds Roberts, "I'm super proud of the work that the committee does and the process we have refined over the years. It's fair and impartial and delivers exactly what we want: the best of the best."



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Q&A: KUPL's Dylan Salisbury

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Were you a country music fan at all growing up?

There weren't any musicians or anyone in the business, but it was a music-loving family. My grandmother played a lot of old country like Conway Twitty, George Jones, Alan Jackson and Patsy Cline, so it was all around me.

And you knew the context when you ended up shifting to on-air Country work...

Yeah, my town-to-town, up-and-down the dial was having Rich Davis as my PD and Gregg Swedberg as my OM at KDWB, where late nights were my first shift. That was back in the days when we still had overnight jocks. From there it was eight months as MD/on-air/social media Brand Mgr. at KFRX/Lincoln, NE, then KKDM/Des Moines for two years as MD/afternoons. I was APD/MD at WZPL/Indianapolis, then got my first programming gig at KKMG/Colorado Springs, where I also did weekends at the Country station, KATC. Westwood One Mainstream Country was looking for jocks within the company, so I tried out and became the night host until I left for Portland in 2022.

What are the differences you notice most between the two formats?

Country seems a lot more robust than Top 40 in the amount of music that's being worked at any given moment. It's a bit harder to keep up with people and learn how things work because there are more people and more calls. Top 40 is more competitive in terms of its reliance on statistics and consumption, where country is more relationship driven.

Obviously you know the ropes from being APD, but what's changed now that you're in the PD role?

I made a lot of new friends over the past couple weeks, which is to be expected. Obviously, when someone new is calling the shots people are

going to reach out. A lot of people probably know me from the "Al Ashley" experiment, but that was never a "let's get rid of people" thing. The aim was to embrace and pioneer the technology. If anything, though, I'm a proon-air staff guy. I want real people on the air and in the studio around the clock, if possible. At the same time, we're going to be tech forward and try things even if they don't work out.

What did the AI jock experiment teach you?

First, AI is not going anywhere, it's just going to continue to grow and develop. We use AI already in nearly every facet of our life and would be fools not to. That's not to say it belongs on the air, but it's not to say that it doesn't. Still, if I have a choice between a real personality or AI, I'm going to choose real people every time.


I want my staff to use AI to make their jobs easier and better, whether that's to write copy or start ideas. We're still using it, but I don't think we'll see the fully AI Ashley situation again. At the same time, if Bobby Bones can't turn around copy in time for something we need quickly, that's an area where AI could be extremely helpful.


