#### **Market Analysis: Pittsburgh**

If anyone ever wondered if Pittsburgh is a country town, CBS Radio's WDSY (Y108) offered a pretty clear answer in 2013. The station saw three consecutive best-ever 6+ shares from May through July (7.9, 8.6 and 9.3) and ranked or tied for No. 1 by



that measure from June through September. And though Keymarket's non-subscribing Country trimulcast WOGI-WOGG-WOGH (Froggy) doesn't compete directly with WDSY in every county in the metro, it has its own story about shaping area listening. Country Aircheck spoke to WDSY OM/ PD Mark Anderson and WOGI PD Dave Anthony for a Steel City temp check.

For WDSY, 2013 was history-making. "It marked our first

number one ranking in 45 years," Anderson says. "It was a thrill. Turning it into a streak was sweeter." Among Persons 25-54, WDSY was No. 3 on the year with an 8.1. It reached as high as No. 2 in that demo with a 9.3 in June. "It just validates the strength of the brand, the position that Y108 occupies in the marketplace and the great work that this team does every day," he adds.



Anderson cites the 2012 reunion of Jimmy Roach and Brian Montgomery as key. "They were one of the final pieces that helped propel the station's growth over the past 18 months," he says. Roach and Montgomery paired on 'DSY for much of the '90s. During the 2000s, Roach worked for Keymarket's Froggy stations. He and Montgomery reunited on 'DSY in April 2012 (CAT 3/28/12). Last June and July, the show ranked No. 2 in the market among Persons 25-54, and again in November. On the year they averaged No. 4 in that demo.

Rounding out the WDSY of the airstaff are middayer Ally,



Richards says. "This panel is built to give people specific strategies and tactics to walk away with and implement Monday when we get back to our radio stations."

3D Media Ventures President **Jon Erdahl** will offer strategy development ideas. Marketron's **Jeffrey Karlov** will present ways that display, rich media and creative digital sales promotions can impact revenue. And Adswizz VP/Business Development **Rockie Thomas** will cover ways to use audio streaming, podcasts, video and ad insertion for increased revenue, and will give examples of stations doing so successfully.

"What they can offer is their perspective working in the digital world every day," Richards says. "They can help with ideas. They can share studies and success stories, and how they can be integrated into your station and work for your clients. You've got to get past any fear that you have and be a part of this cultural shift. That comes with education, and these guys are all experts in the field."

**Analyze This:** As a follow-up to Wednesday's (2/19) "CRS Research Presentation," Richards will be joined by Edison's **Larry Rosen** and media strategist **Jayne Charneski**. "In my 25+ years in the Country format I have never been part of a research project within the format that's been specifically targeted to 12-to-34-year-olds," Richards says. The session aims to suggest strategies and



adjustments to existing strategy to target that younger demo. "Every year at CRS there are different themes that just kind of bubble up," he says. "This has the potential to be one of those themes – our appeal now to a

younger demo and how we continue to build on that."



and-a-half of wine. Party! He's also one of my close friends.

**On Don Williams:** Don Williams could be lapped by a Galapagos tortoise. You could tell Don, "Hey, Don, your pants are on fire!" and he'd get to that eventually sometime the next day.



Whenever Don was on my show, I always felt like he was on a delay system. Sometimes when you watch the news, the anchor is talking to a reporter who's someplace like Tanzania, with his hand to his ear. The anchor asks a question and about ten seconds **go** by before the reporter answers. That's a satellite delay. Don Williams is always talking to you from Tanzania.

**On Reba:** I met "Red" (or, as we often use between each other, "Ruby Two Shoes") about thirty years ago at some event. She was with her Mercury record execs, and I actually met her three separate times, introduced by various guys. The third time she laughed and said, "I got it. His name is Jurry and he's on the rayjoe." That's how it sounds to me when she talks. Jurry on the rayjoe.

**On songwriters:** Songwriters are brain-damaged. Imagine working alone in a room or with another songwriter on a tune for hours on end. Crafting the lyrics, honing the melody. Working the demo and pitching it to an artist. It bombs. Nobody likes it. Not one human being on the planet says, "I am going to record that." That happens in Nashville over and over and over.

Being a songwriter is like being a pinata for judgment. People will listen to ten seconds' worth, turn down the volume, and start talking about their hemorrhoids. Your heart and soul are still playing in the background. Whoever is listening rejects it within seconds, and without so much as a whisper of regret says, "What else ya got?"



Spin Doctors Music Group Dir./Client Services Joe Redmond discusses his most influential artists, concerts, songs and albums:

1. Dan Seals/One Friend: When I first heard it I thought that it expressed all the positive points in a relationship. To that end, I sang it to my bride at our wedding. (Yeah, go ahead and say it out loud ... you're thinking it, anyway!)

2. James Otto/The Days Of Our

**Lives:** Very simple, but the sentiment expressed is valid – cherish every day you have.

- 3. Razzy Bailey/Nightlife: Not the original Willie Nelson version. It was the B-side of "Midnight Hauler" or something. Please allow me to explain to all the youngsters in our audience, in the old days we played vinyl records that had two sides! I know, right? It's a fond memory from my first radio job.
- 4. The Wild Jimbos/ Let's Talk Dirty In Hawaiian and Fred Knobloch/ Why Not Me: It's a tie. "Let's Talk Dirty In Hawaiian" was just fun and funny. And "Why Not Me" expressed all the teenage angst I felt.
- 5. Michael Johnson/Give Me Wings and Looking Glass/ Brandy (You're A Fine Girl): Another tie. "Give Me Wings" was climbing the charts when I was at LSU and my wife-to-be was at Baylor learning to be more independent. As for "Brandy," I don't really have a reason; just one of my favorites.
- A highly regarded song or album you've never **heard:** Ylvis, "The Fox (What Does the Fox Say?)
- An "important" piece of music you just don't get: Acid rock, hard rock, etc. I want to listen to a song, not get screamed at. It's got some great instrument solos, but I don't consider that music.



APD/MD/afternooner **Stoney Richards**, and AMD/night host **Wookie**. "Our on-air team has 155 years of combined on-air experience in the Pittsburgh market," notes Anderson. "And our weekend team of **Charlie Mitchell**, **Dan Simon**, **Heather** and **Dana Griffin** rivals in talent the weekday lineups of most stations."

Musically, WDSY is 46% current, 28% recurrent and 26% gold, according to a recent seven-day Mediabase analysis. Add decisions are a product of teamwork. "Stoney Richards and Wookie join me for the music meetings each week," Anderson says. "We approach music decisions from entirely different directions, so we feel confident in our collective decisions when we come to consensus on a song."

Anderson has also found himself listening to his instinct more often. "My college education was in Math and Stats, so I've got piles of numbers and I love 'em," he says. "But the more

we drown ourselves in numbers the farther we get away from emotions, and music is about feeling. So I'm trying to trust my gut and the gut of Stoney and Wookie more and more. If we love a song, we'd like to think that our listeners will, too. That's pretty valuable even if you can't assign a numeric value to it."

The list of WDSY-produced concerts and pre-concert parties in 2013 provides a good idea of how busy things are in the promotions department. Examples include Y108's 8 Man Jam, Girls With Guitars, Soldier Salute and Freedom Fest. Kenny Chesney and Taylor Swift concert-goers were treated to pre-concert bashes "Tiki Town" and "Never Ever Land," respectively.

There's just as big an emphasis on community. The station's Boys Of Fall promotion brought Wookie and his show to an area high school each week, and gave each the chance at a special pep rally with Republic/Big Machine's Danielle Bradbury. "Y108 promotions manager **Jeff Davidson** makes great things happen and it's exciting to watch him do what he does," lauds Anderson.

There's far more to what makes WDSY successful, though. "With 45 years in-format, this is an extremely mature and well-defined brand," Anderson explains. "We live at the intersection of that great brand, great personalities, great promotions and marketing and a white-hot format. It's a very privileged situation and being a part of it is not something that we take lightly."

Keymarket's Froggy also had a strong 2013, though its success is measured internally. The group hasn't subscribed to a ratings service for roughly three years, but two of the three signals get respectable penetration on the west and northwest sides of Pittsburgh proper. "We're a competitor in some [Pittsburgh metro] areas, and aren't in others," PD **Dave Anthony** explains. "When you get out of the city limits, you start coming into a very big Country listening area. If we're not equal there, then we're pretty strong."

Being a non-subscriber has had little effect on the station's relationships with Nashville. "People have known these radio stations for a long time and we've built close relationships over the years," Anthony continues. "In fact, we've got a show with Gary Allan, Jon Pardi and Kelleigh Bannen coming up. [The labels] understand how we're positioned in the market and know the geography of the area. We get into parts of Ohio and West Virginia, and into a lot of areas that aren't surveyed. A lot of our clients are middle markets between here and Youngstown that aren't serviced well by Pittsburgh because of lack of penetration.


We cover those places very well."

The airstaff is made up of individual morning shows on each station from 5:30-10am, and is networked for the rest of the day. The Green Team with Boss Frog and Lauren Greene (WOGI), Pete Moss (WOGG) and Wendy Green (WOGH) handle wakeups. Middays, afternoons and nights across all three consist of David Hopperfield, Danger and Leah Klocko, respectively. Musically, the playlist hovers around 54% current, 14% recurrent and 32% gold.

Anthony says his stations' power is best found on the streets. "I don't think there's anyone that does outside promotion any better than we do," he says. "Our jocks understand that we win our cume one person at a time. These days when things are getting a lot more watered down and maybe stations are using a lot more interns to cover events, we're still sending our people out do it. And that's a strength for us."

"Strength" is certainly a good word to describe Country radio in Pittsburgh. Listen to WDSY <a href="here">here</a>. —Russ Penuell CAC




and we damn sure don't follow trends." Listen for Colt Ford and American Idol finalist Sarah Ross in "We All Country."


